	protection and preservation of Lake Erie to be	7
	purchased with proceeds from the Parks and	8
	Recreation Improvement Fund and to appropriate	9
	funds for projects enhancing water quality in	10
	the Western Lake Erie Basin.	11

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That section 154.22 of the Revised Code be	12
amended to read as follows:	13
Sec. 154.22. (A) Subject to authorization by the general	14
assembly under section 154.02 of the Revised Code, the issuing	15
authority may authorize and issue obligations pursuant to this	16
chapter to pay costs of capital facilities for parks and	17
recreation.	18

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(B) Any capital facilities for parks and recreation may be	19
leased by the commission to the department of natural resources	20
and other agreements may be made by the commission and such	21
department with respect to the use or purchase of such capital	22
facilities or, subject to the approval of the director of such	23
department, the commission may lease such capital facilities to,	24
and make other agreements with respect to their use or purchase	25
with, any governmental agency having authority under law to	26
operate such capital facilities, and the director of such	27
department may sublease such capital facilities to, and make	28
other agreements with respect to the use or purchase thereof	29
with, any such governmental agency, or such director may	30
sublease or contract for the operation of such capital	31
facilities in accordance with the applicable provisions of	32
sections 1501.09, 1501.091, and 1501.10 of the Revised Code, all	33
upon such terms and conditions as the parties may agree upon and	34
pursuant to this chapter, notwithstanding any other provisions	35
of law affecting the leasing, acquisition, or disposition of	36
capital facilities by such parties.	37

(C) For purposes of this section, "available receipts" 38 means all receipts, including fees, charges, and rentals, 39 derived or to be derived from state parks and public service 40 facilities in any state park or parks, any other receipts of 41 state agencies with respect to parks and recreational 42 facilities, any revenues or receipts derived by the commission 43 from the operation, leasing, or other disposition of capital 44 facilities financed under this section, the proceeds of 45 obligations issued under this section and sections 154.11 and 46 154.12 of the Revised Code, and also means any gifts, grants, 47 donations, and pledges, and receipts thereon, available for the 48 payment of bond service charges on obligations issued under this 49 H. B. No. 643
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section. The issuing authority may pledge all, or such portion as it determines, of the available receipts to the payment of bond service charges on obligations issued under this section and sections 154.11 and 154.12 of the Revised Code and for the establishment and maintenance of any reserves, as provided in the bond proceedings, and make other provisions therein with 5.5 respect to such available receipts as authorized by this chapter, which provisions shall be controlling notwithstanding any other provision of law pertaining thereto.

- (D) The issuing authority may covenant in the bond proceeding that the state and state agencies shall, so long as any obligations issued under this section are outstanding, cause to be charged and collected fees, charges, and rentals for the use of state parks and public service facilities and other fees and charges with respect to parks and recreation sufficient in amount to provide for the payment of bond service charges on such obligations and for the establishment and maintenance of any reserves as provided in the bond proceedings, and such covenants shall be controlling notwithstanding any other provision of law pertaining to such charges except any provision of law prohibiting or limiting charges for the use of swimming facilities of state parks and public service facilities by persons under sixteen years of age.
- (E) There is hereby created the parks and recreation bond service trust fund, which shall be in the custody of the treasurer of state but shall be separate and apart from and not a part of the state treasury. All moneys received by or on account of the commission or issuing authority or state agencies and required by the applicable bond proceedings to be deposited, transferred, or allocated to or received for the purposes of the trust fund shall be deposited with the treasurer of state and

credited to such fund, subject to applicable provisions of the	81
bond proceedings but without necessity for any act of	82
appropriation. The trust fund is hereby pledged to the payment	83
of bond service charges on the obligations issued pursuant to	84
this section and sections 154.11 and 154.12 of the Revised Code	85
to the extent provided in the applicable bond proceedings, and	86
payment thereof from such fund shall be made or provided for by	87
the treasurer of state in accordance with such bond proceedings	88
without necessity for any act of appropriation.	89

- (F) There is hereby created in the state treasury the 90 91 parks and recreation improvement fund. Subject to the bond proceedings therefor, all of the proceeds of the sale of 92 obligations issued pursuant to this section shall be credited to 93 such fund, except that any accrued interest received shall be 94 credited to the parks and recreation bond service trust fund. 95 The parks and recreation improvement fund may also be comprised 96 of gifts, grants, appropriated moneys, and other sums and 97 securities received to the credit of such the fund. Such The 98 fund shall be applied only to for the purpose of paying costs of 99 capital facilities for parks and recreation under the 100 jurisdiction of the department of natural resources or for 101 participation in capital facilities for parks and recreation 102 with the federal government, municipal corporations, counties, 103 or other governmental agencies, or any one or more of them, 104 which participation may be by grants or contributions to them 105 for such capital facilities. The fund also may be used to 106 purchase equipment used for the protection or preservation of 107 Lake Erie and its tributaries. All investment earnings on the 108 cash balance in the fund shall be credited to the fund. 109
- (G) All state parks shall be exclusively under the control 110 and administration of the division of parks and watercraft. The 111

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director of natural resources may by order remove from the	112
classification as state parks any of the lands or interests	113
therein referred to in divisions (M)(2) and (3) of section	114
154.01 of the Revised Code, subject to the limitations,	115
provisions, and conditions in any order authorizing state park	116
revenue bonds, in any trust agreement securing such bonds, or in	117
bond proceedings with respect to obligations issued pursuant to	118
this section. Lands or interests therein so removed shall be	119
transferred to other divisions of the department for	120
administration or may be sold as provided by law. Proceeds of	121
any sale shall be used or transferred as provided in the order	122
authorizing state park revenue bonds or in such trust agreement,	123
or in bond proceedings with respect to obligations issued	124
pursuant to this section, and if no such provision is made shall	125
be transferred to the state park fund created by section 1546.21	126
of the Revised Code.	127
(H) This section shall be applied with other applicable	128
provisions of this chapter.	129
(I) Any instrument by which real property is acquired	130
pursuant to this section shall identify the agency of the state	131
that has the use and benefit of the real property as specified	132
in section 5301.012 of the Revised Code.	133
