BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1 . That sections 3313.25, 3313.31, and 3319.36 of	6
the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3313.25. Before entering upon the duties of his	8
office, the treasurer of each board of education shall execute a	9
bond, in an amount and with surety to be approved by the board,	10
payable to the state, conditioned for the faithful performance	11
of all the official duties required of him the treasurer. Such	12
bond must be deposited with the president of the board, and a	13
copy thereof, certified by him the president, shall be filed	14
with the county auditor.	15
A treasurer shall not be held liable for a loss of public	16
funds when the treasurer has performed all official duties	17
required of the treasurer with reasonable care, but shall be	18

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liable only when a loss of public funds results from the treasurer's negligence or other wrongful act. Sec. 3313.31. (A) All the duties and obligations of the county auditor, county treasurer, or other officer or person relating to the moneys of a school district shall be complied with by dealing with the treasurer of the board of education thereof. The treasurer shall be the chief fiscal officer of the school district, shall be responsible for the financial affairs of the district, and shall report to and is subject to the direction of the district board of education. Except as otherwise required by law, no treasurer shall be required to verify the accuracy of nonfinancial information or data of the school district. No treasurer shall be liable for a loss of public funds honfinancial information or data of the school district, including reports in the education management information system

Sec. 3319.36. (A) No treasurer of a board of education or	48	
educational service center shall draw a check for the payment of	49	
a teacher for services until the teacher files with the	50	
treasurer both of the following conditions are satisfied:	51	
(1) Such The treasurer receives a written statement from	52	
the district or service center superintendent, or	53	
superintendent's designee, that the teacher has filed with the	54	
superintendent or designee such reports as are required by the	55	
state board of education, the school district board of	56	
education, or the <u>district or service center</u> superintendent of	57

(2) Except for <u>in the case of</u> a teacher who is engaged	59	
pursuant to section 3319.301 of the Revised Code, the treasurer	60	
receives a written statement from the city, exempted village, or	61	
local school district or service center superintendent or the	62

designee that the teacher has filed with the treasurer	64	
superintendent or designee a legal educator license, or true	65

(C) Upon notice to the treasurer given by the state board	91
of education or any superintendent having jurisdiction that	92
reports required of a teacher have not been made, the treasurer	93
shall withhold the salary of the teacher until the required	94
reports are completed and furnished.	95
(D) No treasurer of a board of education or educational	96
service center shall be liable for a loss of public funds for	97
any payments to a teacher that are made by the treasurer in	98
compliance with this section, unless the loss results from the	99
treasurer's negligence or other wrongful act.	100
(E) No superintendent of a school district or educational	101
service center or the superintendent's designee shall be liable	102
for a loss of public funds for any payments to a teacher that	103
are made by the district or service center treasurer in	104

compliance with this section, unless the loss results from the

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superintendent's negligence or other wrongful act.	106
Section 2. That existing sections 3313.25, 3313.31, and	107
3319.36 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	108
