BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 381.360 of Am. Sub. H.B. 49 of the	10
132nd General Assembly be amended to read as follows:	11
Sec. 381.360. OHIO COLLEGE OPPORTUNITY GRANT	12
(A) Except as provided in division (C) of this section:	13
Of the foregoing appropriation item 235563, Ohio College	14
Opportunity Grant, \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2019 shall be used	15
by the Chancellor of Higher Education to award supplemental	16
need-based financial aid to students enrolled in eligible public	17
institutions of higher education, excluding early college high	18
school and post-secondary enrollment options participants. Any	19

supplemental awards distributed by the Chancellor to students	20
shall be in addition to any amounts awarded to students in	21
eligible public institutions of higher education in the 2018-	22
2019 academic year under this section as it existed prior to the	23
effective date of this amendment.	24
Of the foregoing appropriation item 235563, Ohio College	25
Opportunity Grant, at least \$94,010,433 in fiscal year 2018 and	26
at least \$95,351,123 in fiscal year 2019 shall be used by the	27
Chancellor of Higher Education to award need-based financial aid	28
to students enrolled in eligible public and private nonprofit	29
institutions of higher education, excluding early college high	30
school and post-secondary enrollment option participants.	31
The remainder of the foregoing appropriation item 235563,	32
Ohio College Opportunity Grant, shall be used by the Chancellor	33
to award needs-based financial aid to students enrolled in	34
eligible private for-profit career colleges and schools.	35
(B)(1) As used in this section:	36
(a) "Eligible institution" means any institution described	37
in divisions (B)(2)(a) to (c) of section 3333.122 of the Revised	38
Code.	39
(b) The three "sectors" of institutions of higher	40
education consist of the following:	41
(i) State colleges and universities, community colleges,	42
state community colleges, university branches, and technical	43
colleges;	44
(ii) Eligible private nonprofit institutions of higher	45
education;	46
(iii) Eligible private for-profit career colleges and	47

schools.	48
(2) Awards for students attending eligible private	49
nonprofit institutions of higher education shall be determined	50
at twice the rate of the awards for students attending eligible	51
public institutions of higher education.	52
(3) For students attending an eligible institution year-	53
round, awards may be distributed on an annual basis, once Pell	54
grants have been exhausted.	55
(4) If the Chancellor determines that the amounts	56
appropriated for support of the Ohio College Opportunity Grant	57
program are inadequate to provide grants to all eligible	58
students as calculated under division (D) of section 3333.122 of	59
the Revised Code, the Chancellor may create a distribution	60
formula for fiscal year 2018 and fiscal year 2019 based on the	61
formula used in fiscal year 2017, or may follow methods	62
established in division (C)(1)(a) or (b) of section 3333.122 of	63
the Revised Code. The Chancellor shall notify the Controlling	64
Board of the distribution method. Any formula calculated under	65
this division shall be complete and established to coincide with	66

(C) Prior to determining the amount of funds available to	68
award under this section and section 3333.122 of the Revised	69
Code, the Chancellor shall use the foregoing appropriation item	70
235563, Ohio College Opportunity Grant, to pay for renewals or	71
partial renewals of scholarships students receive under the Ohio	72
Academic Scholarship Program under sections 3333.21 and 3333.22	73
of the Revised Code. In paying for scholarships under this	74
division, the Chancellor shall deduct funds from the allocations	75
made under division (A) of this section. Deductions shall be	76
proportionate to the amounts allocated to each sector from the	77

total amounts appropriated for each sector under the foregoing	78
appropriation item 235563, Ohio College Opportunity Grant.	79
In each fiscal year, with the exception of sections	80
3333.121 and 3333.124 of the Revised Code and the section of	81
this act Am. Sub. H.B. 49 of the 132nd General Assembly entitled	82
"STATE FINANCIAL AID RECONCILIATION," the Chancellor shall not	83
distribute or obligate or commit to be distributed an amount	84
greater than what is appropriated under the foregoing	85
appropriation item 235563, Ohio College Opportunity Grant.	86
(D) The Chancellor shall establish, and post on the	87
Department of Higher Education's web site, award tables based on	88
any formulas created under division (B) of this section. The	89
Chancellor shall notify students and institutions of any	90
reductions in awards under this section.	91
(E) Notwithstanding section 3333.122 of the Revised Code,	92
no student shall be eligible to receive an Ohio College	93
Opportunity Grant for more than ten semesters, fifteen quarters,	94
or the equivalent of five academic years, less the number of	95
semesters or quarters in which the student received an Ohio	96
Instructional Grant.	97
(F) During each fiscal year, the Chancellor, as soon as	98
possible after cancellation, may certify to the Director of	99
Budget and Management the amount of canceled prior-year	100
encumbrances in appropriation item 235563, Ohio College	101
Opportunity Grant. Upon receipt of the certification, the	102
Director of Budget and Management may transfer cash, up to the	103
certified amount, from the General Revenue Fund to the Ohio	104
College Opportunity Grant Program Reserve Fund (Fund 5PU0).	105
