BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3301.0718 and 3313.6011 be	10
amended and section 3301.0727 of the Revised Code be enacted to	11
read as follows:	12
Sec. 3301.0718. (A) The state board of education shall not	13
adopt or revise any standards or curriculum in the area of	14
health_venereal disease education_unless, by concurrent	15
resolution, the standards, curriculum, or revisions are approved	16
by both houses of the general assembly. Before the house of	17
representatives or senate votes on a concurrent resolution	18

approving health venereal disease education standards,	19
curriculum, or revisions, its standing committee having	20
jurisdiction over education legislation shall conduct at least	21
one public hearing on the standards, curriculum, or revisions.	22
(B) Each district and school shall be free to develop its	23
own standards and curriculum for instruction in venereal disease	24
education that emphasizes abstinence, in accordance with section	25
3313.6011 of the Revised Code.	26
Sec. 3301.0727. (A) Not later than July 1, 2019, the state	27
board of education shall develop and adopt health education	28
standards for the purpose of health education in grades	29
kindergarten through twelve. The methodology used by the state	30
board to develop the standards shall be based on the methodology	31
used by the state board to develop standards in other academic	32
<pre>content areas.</pre>	33
(B) The department of education shall provide the adopted	34
standards, and any revisions to the standards, to all school	35
districts, community schools established under Chapter 3314.,	36
STEM schools established under Chapter 3326., and college-	37
preparatory boarding schools established under Chapter 3328. of	38
the Revised Code. Any school or district may utilize the	39
standards.	40
Sec. 3313.6011. (A) As used in this section, "sexual	41
activity" has the same meaning as in section 2907.01 of the	42
Revised Code.	
(B) Instruction in venereal disease education pursuant to	44
division (A)(5)(c) of section 3313.60 of the Revised Code shall	45
emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity is the only	46
protection that is one hundred per cent effective against	47

unwanted pregnancy, sexually transmitted disease, and the sexual	48
transmission of a virus that causes acquired immunodeficiency	49
syndrome.	50
(C) In adopting minimum standards under section 3301.07 of	51
the Revised Code, the state board of education shall require	52
course material and instruction in venereal disease education	53
courses taught pursuant to division (A)(5)(c) of section 3313.60	54
of the Revised Code to do all of the following:	55
(1) Stress that students should abstain from sexual	56
activity until after marriage;	57
(2) Teach the potential physical, psychological,	58
emotional, and social side effects of participating in sexual	59
activity outside of marriage;	60
(3) Teach that conceiving children out of wedlock is	61
likely to have harmful consequences for the child, the child's	62
parents, and society;	63
(4) Stress that sexually transmitted diseases are serious	64
possible hazards of sexual activity;	65
(5) Advise students of the laws pertaining to financial	66
responsibility of parents to children born in and out of	67
wedlock;	68
(6) Advise students of the circumstances under which it is	69
criminal to have sexual contact with a person under the age of	70
sixteen pursuant to section 2907.04 of the Revised Code;	71
(7) Emphasize adoption as an option for unintended	72
pregnancies.	73
(D) Any model education program for health venereal	74
disease education the state board of education adopts shall	75

conform to the requirements of this section.	76
(E) On and after March 18, 1999, and notwithstanding	77
section 3302.07 of the Revised Code, the superintendent of	78
public instruction shall not approve, pursuant to section	79
3302.07 of the Revised Code, any waiver of any requirement of	80
this section or of any rule adopted by the state board of	81
education pursuant to this section.	82
Section 2. That existing sections 3301.0718 and 3313.6011	83
of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	84
