### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

| Section 1. That section 4511.531 of the Revised Code be         | 9  |

| Sec. 4511.531. (A) As used in this section:                     | 11 |
| (1) "Approved helmet" means a helmet that meets or exceeds      | 12 |
| the standards for protective bicycle helmets established by the | 13 |
| American national standards institute, the American society for | 14 |
| testing and materials, or the Snell memorial foundation.        | 15 |
| (2) "Low-income family" means a family with an income not       | 16 |
| exceeding the federal poverty guidelines as defined in section  | 17 |
| 5101.46 of the Revised Code.                                    | 18 |
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| (B)(1) No person under eighteen years of age shall operate       | 1,9 |
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| a bicycle on a roadway unless that person is wearing an approved | 20  |
| helmet that is of good fit and is fastened securely on the       | 21  |
| person's head.   | 22  |
| (2) No person under eighteen years of age shall be a             | 23  |
| passenger on a bicycle on a roadway, including as a passenger in | 24  |
| a restraining seat or in a bicycle trailer, unless the person is | 25  |
| wearing an approved helmet that is of good fit and is fastened   | 26  |

| (C) (1) Whoever violates division (B) of this section shall      | 28  |
| be fined twenty-five dollars. The parent, guardian, or other     | 29  |
| person having custody of the offender is responsible for the     | 30  |
| payment of any fine imposed under this division.                 | 31  |
| (2) Upon receipt by the court of satisfactory proof that         | 32  |
| the offender has a protective helmet, the court may waive the    | 33  |
| fine for the violation.  | 34  |
| (3) All fines collected for a violation of division (B) of       | 35  |
| this section shall be forwarded to the treasurer of state and    | 36  |
| credited to the bicycle safety fund, which is hereby created in  | 37  |
| the state treasury. The department of public safety shall use    | 38  |
| the money credited to the fund to assist low-income families in  | 39  |
| the purchase of approved bicycle helmets in accordance with      | 4 C |

| Section 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the           | 52 |
| contrary, for the period of one year after the effective date of | 53 |
| this act, no law enforcement officer shall issue a ticket,       | 54 |
| citation, or summons to a person who violates division (B) of    | 55 |
| section 4511.531 of the Revised Code. During that time, the law  | 56 |
| enforcement officer instead shall issue the person a written     |    |
| warning explaining the provisions of section 4511.531 of the     |    |
| Revised Code. The written warning may notify the person of the   | 59 |
| specific date, one year after the effective date of this act,    | 60 |
| when law enforcement officers shall begin enforcing the          |    |
| provisions of section 4511.531 of the Revised Code.              |    |
