To the Honorable Timothy Ginter,

Thank you for the opportunity that you have afforded to me, and many others like me, an opportunity to give our voices in support of HB 286 – The Ohio Pastor's Protection Act.

It is unfortunate that legislation must be drafted and enacted to protect that which is common sense and reasonable to every man and woman. The fact that a bill has to be passed to protect a person's conscience shows you the absolute absurdity in which the state has found themselves. Because those who are intolerant of others people's beliefs claim tolerance, which is a great fallacy and actually oppression, we find ourselves in this position of good being called evil and evil being called good and in need of laws to protect us from an ever growing government overreach.

It is the capacity to know the difference between right and wrong and make a conscious decision based upon that knowledge. While many that live among us may appear not to exercise any conscience, the reality is that have simply allowed their conscience to be seared and calloused toward the absolute truth and created relative truth in their minds.
