I believe we are on our 3<sup>rd</sup> year receiving the scholarship. As a family with five children, this scholarship has been invaluable. It has given us the opportunity to send our child to a school that has the culture and values we share in our home.

As the parent of a small child entering elementary years, it can be rather daunting to consider which school to send your child to. Our kids attended preschool at Immanuel Lutheran so it seemed like a natural extension of their first learning experience. We were impressed with the class size, student-teacher ratio, and test scores with higher averages compared to public school. The family atmosphere, faith based curriculum and proximity to our home made Immanuel Lutheran school an appealing choice.

Immanuel Lutheran has been a vibrant school that has afforded our children many opportunities. They have been able to attend cooking classes, start sports programs, help with community outreaches, go on retreats, participate in talent shows, perform at local farmer's market and the list goes on.
