Dear Chairman Smith:

The Ohio Service Industry Coalition wants to once again thank you and the members of the House Finance Committee for your continued dedication to promoting sound tax policies in the State of Ohio.

Our Coalition, a group of businesses, trade associations, and professional organizations in industries affecting the day-to-day lives of many Ohioans, maintains its strong opposition to the sales tax rate increase and expansion to services in HB 49, the executive budget proposal.

Since the time of the executive budget proposal's unveiling in January, our Coalition has grown and now includes more than twenty-five organizations representing many different industries all across the state.

In 2016, the industries represented by Coalition members collectively had approximately 1 million employees, 60,000 establishments, and a total compensation of nearly \$40 billion.

We would like to reiterate our Coalition's strong agreement with legislative leaders who have expressed opposition to elements of tax shifting in HB 49, as introduced.

Our Coalition opposes raising the state sales tax rate and extending state and local sales taxes to services not already taxed under Ohio law. Higher sales tax rates and new taxes on targeted services will slow sales, hurt the state's competitiveness, and raise costs for individual and business consumers.

We appreciate the opportunity to share with you our concerns, and we look forward to working with you and the other members of the General Assembly to make Ohio a more business-friendly state.
