Thank you for giving me the opportunity today to request an honor for Sgt. Glen Allan Millinger. Glen was born in Oak Harbor, Ohio on October 6, 1948 the only son of Rollie and Gladys Millinger. He lived on Benton – Carroll Road and attended Salem - Oak Harbor High School.

He was inducted into the Army on June 6, 1968 and attended a special school to quickly advance to the sergeants rank. He was then deployed to Vietnam on May 27, 1969 as a member of D CO, 1st BN, 503rd Infantry, 173rd ABN BDE. He was killed on August 3, 1969 in Binh Dinh Province, South Vietnam by another explosive device.

Glen is currently survived by his sister, step sisters, step brother, nieces, nephews, great nieces and great nephews. On behalf of his family I would like to request a memorial sign be placed near Benton – Carroll Road in his honor for his service to his country by passing this bill favorably out of committee.
