Chairman Green, Vice-chair Greenspan, Ranking Member Sheehy and members of the House Transportation Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide sponsor testimony this morning on House Bill 261, which would create a "Walsh Jesuit High School" license plate.

Walsh Jesuit is a 4-year co-educational college preparatory high school in my district. Founded in 1964 and rooted in the Jesuit tradition of scholastic achievement, they are recognized and respected not only for their academic excellence but also for their ability to consistently develop competence, conscience and compassion in their student body and within their graduates. This Jesuit characteristic, of "cura personalis" means that they care for the entire person: mind, body and spirit. my brother, we recognized that they were committed to cultivating graduates who are faithful, intellectually competent, and committed to doing justice.
