On behalf of Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center, thank you for sponsoring Senate Bill 57 that would designate May 17 Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma (DPIG) Awareness Day. Unfortunately, DIPG is one of a small number of pediatric cancers where we struggle to find answers and where there is no known cure. We believe DIPG could be the lynchpin to solving many other pediatric and adult cancers due to the genetics of how the DPIG tumors grow.
