To enact sections 1	73.07, 173.071, 173.072, and	1

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 173.07, 173.071, 173.072, and	4
173.073 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	
Sec. 173.07. (A) As used in this section and sections	6
173.071 to 173.073 of the Revised Code, "dementia" includes	
<u>Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder.</u>	8
<u>(B) The department of aging shall issue a certificate in</u>	9
dementia care to an individual if all of the following	10
requirements are satisfied:

(1) The individual has submitted to the department a	12
completed application for the certificate as specified in rules	13
adopted by the department under section 173.073 of the Revised	14
<u>Code.</u>	15
(2) The individual has completed a course of study in	16

dementia care that has been approved by the department under	
section 173.071 of the Revised Code.	18
(3) The individual has paid to the department a license	19
fee in the amount specified in rules adopted by the department	
under section 173.073 of the Revised Code.	21
(C) A certificate in dementia care shall certify that the	22
individual to whom it was issued has met the requirements of	23
this section and any rules adopted under section 173.073 of the	24
Revised Code and is certified while the certificate is valid.	25
Sec. 173.071. (A) The department of aging shall review and	26
approve training and education programs for dementia care. An	27
approved program is one that the department has identified as	28
providing the requisite education and experience necessary to	29
qualify an individual for a certificate in dementia care.	30
(B) The department shall develop a list of approved	31
dementia care training and education programs. The department	32
shall organize the list by health care professional type and may	33
require programs to meet different criteria depending on the	34
professional type. A person may contact the department to seek	35
approval for a dementia care training or education program.	36
(C) A dementia care training or education program approved	37
under this section shall include all of the following topics:	38
(1) Expectations of health care providers when caring for	39
individuals with dementia;	40
(2) Person-centered training and care planning, including	41
<u>cultural awareness;</u>	42
(3) Social and physical environment characteristics that	43
trigger or exacerbate behavioral and psychological symptoms of	44

(4) Meaningful and engaging activities for individuals	46
with dementia;	47
(5) Pain assessment;	48
(6) Medication management;	49
(7) Family dynamics for families with a member who has	50
dementia;	51
(8) General information about dementia;	52
(9) How to assist an individual with dementia with daily	53
living activities, including evaluating preferences and goals;	54
(10) Problem-solving challenging behavior from an	55
individual with dementia, including nonpharmacological	56
intervention;	57
(11) Communication skills relating to individuals with	58

Sec. 173.072. No person shall knowingly use any of the	60
following unless the person holds a certificate in dementia	61
care:	62
(A) The title "certified in dementia care," "dementia_	63
practitioner," "certified Alzheimer's disease practitioner," or	64
"certified in Alzheimer's care";	65
(B) The acronym "CDC," "DP," "CADP," or "CAC," after the	66
person's name;	67
(C) Any other words, letters, signs, cards, or devices	68
that tend to indicate or imply that the person is certified in	69
dementia care.	70

Sec. 173.073. The department shall adopt rules under		
section 173.02 of the Revised Code as necessary to implement the		
provisions of sections 173.07 to 173.072 of the Revised Code.	73	
The rules shall specify all of the following with respect to the		
certificate in dementia care:		
(A) The form and manner by which an individual is to apply	76	
for and renew the certificate;	77	
(B) Any application and renewal fees for the certificate;	78	
(C) The duration of the certificate;	79	
(D) Any provisions for suspension or revocation of the	80	
certificate;		
(E) Penalties for violations of section 173.072 of the	82	
Revised Code;	83	
(F) Anything else necessary to implement sections 173.07	84	
to 173.072 of the Revised Code.		
Section 2. Section 1 of this act shall take effect six	86	
months after this act's effective date.	87
