(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 39 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 40 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 41 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 42 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 43 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 44 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 45 other money in that fund. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions received

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pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism	48
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs	49

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 73 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 74 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 75 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 76

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 460 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 461 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 462 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 463 providing services to the school district's students that assist 464 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 465 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 466 467 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 468 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 469 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 470 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 471 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 472 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 473 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 474 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 475 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 476 training in providing such services to the students of the 477 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 478 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 479 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 480 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 481 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 482
