## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.70 of the	4
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	29
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	30
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	31
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	32
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	33
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	34
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	35
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	36
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or	37
other abortion-related activities.	38
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	39
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the	40
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall	41
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that	42

organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received47pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism48society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs49

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and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 51 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 52 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 53 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 54 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 55 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 56 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 57 directly to their clients. 58

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 70 St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 71 its research and other programs. 72

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar73receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to74special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions75for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.76

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar77receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the78

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children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 79 contributions for its research and other programs. 80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 82 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 83 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 84 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 87 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 88 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 89 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 92 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 93 contributions into its general account to be used for 94 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 95 America foundation. 96

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 97 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 98 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 99 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 100 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions received102pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio103cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for104scholarships and other educational activities.105

The registrar shall pay the contributions received106pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the107

organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 108 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 109 that organization. 110

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 111 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 112 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 113 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 114 section. A university or college that receives contributions 115 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 116 scholarship fund. 117

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 118 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 119 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 120 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 121 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 122 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 123 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 124 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 125 funds as provided in this section. 126

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar127receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the128Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying129for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio130cyclists of all ages.131

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 132 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 133 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 134 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 135 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 136 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 137

educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 140 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 141 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 142 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 143

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar144receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the145Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the146contributions only to promote and support the football team of147Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.148

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 149 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 150 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 152 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 153 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 154 sponsors within this state. 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 157 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 158 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 159 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 160 activities. 161

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar162receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the163Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives164under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing165its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services166

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to children, young adults, and families in this state. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 169 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 170 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 171 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 172 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 173 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 174 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 175 the improvement of patient outcomes. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 178 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 179 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 180 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 181 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 182 personnel, veterans, and their families. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 185 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 186 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 187 families. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 190 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 191 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 192 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 193 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 194 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 195 destination. 196

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 197 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 198 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 199 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 200 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 201

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 202 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 203 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 204 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 205 206 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 207 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 208 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 209 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 210 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 211 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 212

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar213receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the214rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.215

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 216 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 217 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 218 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 219 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 220 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 221 222 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 223 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 224 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 225 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 226

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incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received	227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar260receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to261Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute262to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar268receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the269Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the270contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar272receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the273girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the274contributions to support the activities of the organization.275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 276 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 277 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 278 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 279 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 280 local beekeeping programs. 281

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar282receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the283national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the284

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contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace285legends to inspire future leaders.286

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 287 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 288 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 289 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 290 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 291 commission and that is participating in the license plate 292 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 293 of the county of residence of an applicant. 294

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each295contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of296the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates297that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is298participating in the license plate program pursuant to division299(G) of that section.300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 301 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 302 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 303 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 304 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 305 Ohio and for educational programs. 306

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar307receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to308pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of309supporting cancer research.310

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 311 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 312 Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 313

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 314 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 315 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 316 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 317 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 318

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 319 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 320 great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 321 America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 322 equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 323 the girl scouts. 324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar325receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the326Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council327shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner328throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar330receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the331charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m.,332which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 335 Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 336 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 339 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 340 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 341 charitable purposes. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar343receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the344fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall345deposit the fees into its general account to be used for346purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 349 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 350 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 351 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 352 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 353 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 354

The registrar shall pay the contributions received355pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio356concerns of police survivors, which shall use those357contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate358to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed359in the line of duty.360

The registrar shall pay the contributions received361pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater362Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those363contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in364the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 367 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 368 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 369 families. 370

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 372 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 373 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 374 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 375 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 376 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 377 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 378 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 379 380 participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar385receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to386Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the387contributions into its general account to be used for purposes388of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.389

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 390 receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 391 Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 392 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 393 Cleveland, Ohio. 394

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 395 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 396 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 397 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 398 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 399 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 400 resides. 401

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar402receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the403Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the404contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting405law enforcement education and assistance.406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar407receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the408Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the409moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section4104503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written411agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 413 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 414 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 415 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 416 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 417 rotary foundation. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar419receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the420Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the421contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained422under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar424receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to425buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the426contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar428receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the429Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and430

connection. 432 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433 receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 434 Medina county historical society, which shall use those 435 contributions to distribute between the various historical 436 societies and museums in Medina county. 437 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438 receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the 439 Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the 440 contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and 441 scholarship purposes. 442 443 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 444 Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 445 446 research projects. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447 receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 448 Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 449 450 contributions solely to promote and support the historical preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 451 state. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar453receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the454Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those455contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth456baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar458receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the459

Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 460 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 461 providing services to the school district's students that assist 462 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 463 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 464 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 465 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 466 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 467 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 468 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 469 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 470 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 471 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 472 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 473 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 474 training in providing such services to the students of the 475 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 476 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 477 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 478 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 479 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar481receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the482Canton city school district. The district may use the483contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the484contributions for any political purpose or to pay salaries of485district employees.486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar487receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to488Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal489corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the490

contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 491 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 492 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 493 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 494 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 495 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 496 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 497 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 498 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 499 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 500 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 501 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 502 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 503 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 504 services. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions 771 it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. (2) The additional <u>ten dollar</u> fee of ten dollars shall be, 980 which is for the purpose of compensating the bureau of motor 981 vehicles for additional services required in the issuing of 982 freemason license plates, and shall be transmitted by the 983 registrar to the treasurer of state for deposit into the state 984 treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes 985 fund created by section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 986
