BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Kraner Fund of that 43 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 44 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 45 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 46 other money in that fund. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions received48pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism49

society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 50 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 51 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 53 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 54 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 55 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 56 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 57 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 58 directly to their clients. 59 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60 receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 61 national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 62 it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 63 pancreatic cancer and their families. 64 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 65 receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 66 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 67 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 68 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 69 70 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 71 St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 72 its research and other programs. 73 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 75 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 76 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 79 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 80 contributions for its research and other programs. 81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 82 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 83 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 84 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 85 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 86

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 87 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 88 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 89 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 90 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 91

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar92receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the93future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the94contributions into its general account to be used for95educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of96America foundation.97

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 98 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 99 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 100 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 101 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 102

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 103 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 104 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 105 scholarships and other educational activities. 106

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 107

pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the108organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those109contributions for scholarships for students who are members of110that organization.111

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 112 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 113 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 114 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 115 section. A university or college that receives contributions 116 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 117 scholarship fund. 118

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar128receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the129Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying130for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio131cyclists of all ages.132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 133 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 134 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 135 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 136 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 137

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expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 138 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 139

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 140 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 141 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 142 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 143 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 144

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar145receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the146Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the147contributions only to promote and support the football team of148Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 151 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 153 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 154 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 155 sponsors within this state. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 158 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 159 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 160 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 161 activities. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 164 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 165 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 166 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 167 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 170 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 171 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 172 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 173 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 174 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 175 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 176 177 the improvement of patient outcomes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 179 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 180 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 181 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 182 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 183 personnel, veterans, and their families. 184

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 185 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 186 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 187 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 188 families. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 191 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 192 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 193 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 194 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 195 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 196

destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 198 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 199 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 200 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 201 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 202

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 203 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 204 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 205 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 206 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 207 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 208 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 209 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 210 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 211 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 212 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar214receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the215rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.216

217 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 218 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 219 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 220 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 221 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 222 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 223 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 224 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 225 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 226

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promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 227 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 228 under this section. 229

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 230 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 231 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 232 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 233 programs. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar235receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the236western reserve historical society, which shall use the237contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.238

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 239 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 240 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 241 negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 242 contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 243

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 244 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 245 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 246 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 247 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 248 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 249 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 250 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 251 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 252 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 253 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 254 such payments are to be made. 255 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 256 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 257 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 258 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 259 river watershed. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar261receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to262Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute263to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar273receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the274girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the275contributions to support the activities of the organization.276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 278 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 279 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 280 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 281 local beekeeping programs. 282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar283receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the284

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national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the285contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace286legends to inspire future leaders.287

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 288 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 289 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 290 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 291 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 292 commission and that is participating in the license plate 293 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 294 295 of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each296contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of297the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates298that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is299participating in the license plate program pursuant to division300(G) of that section.301

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 302 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 303 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 304 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 305 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 306 Ohio and for educational programs. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 309 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 310 supporting cancer research. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar312receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the313

Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar315receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the316Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council317shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner318throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar320receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the321great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of322America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an323equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of324the girl scouts.325

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar326receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the327Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council328shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner329throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331 receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 332 Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 333 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar340receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the341fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall342

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deposit the fees into its general account to be used for343purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 346 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 347 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 348 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 349 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 350 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 352 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 353 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 354 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 355 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 356 in the line of duty. 357

The registrar shall pay the contributions received358pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater359Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those360contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in361the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 364 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 365 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 366 families. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar368receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the369organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL370association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under371

Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association372shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in373administering a program to secure the proper representation in374the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent375children, and for the training and supervision of persons376participating in that program.377

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar378receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the379Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the380contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.381

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar382receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to383Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the384contributions into its general account to be used for purposes385of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.386

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in Cleveland, Ohio.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 393 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 394 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 395 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 396 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 397 resides. 398

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar399receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the400

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Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the401contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting402law enforcement education and assistance.403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 405 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 406 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 407 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 408 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 411 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 412 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 413 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 414 rotary foundation. 415

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar416receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the417Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the418contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained419under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar421receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to422buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the423contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.424

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 425 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 426 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 427 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 428 connection. 429

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar456receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the457Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those458

contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth459baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 462 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 463 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 464 providing services to the school district's students that assist 465 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 466 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 467 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 468 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 469 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 470 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 471 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 472 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 473 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 474 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 475 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 476 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 477 training in providing such services to the students of the 478 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 479 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 480 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 481 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 482 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 483

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar484receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the485Canton city school district. The district may use the486contributions for student welfare, but shall not use the487contributions for any political purpose or to pay salaries of488district employees.489

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 490 receives pursuant to section 4503.873 of the Revised Code to 491 Padua Franciscan high school located in the municipal 492 corporation of Parma. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 493 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 494 students.
