## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.68 of the	6
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	7

treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	9

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(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 41 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 42 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 43 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 44 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 45 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 46 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 47 other money in that fund. 48

The registrar shall pay the contributions received

pursuant to	section	4503.493	of the Revised Code to the autism
society of	Ohio, whi	ch shall	use the contributions for programs

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 75 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 76 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 77 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	79
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the	80
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the	81
contributions for its research and other programs.	82

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to

the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to

raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic

pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to

the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide

children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund

research for the cure of childhood cancers.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the

future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the

contributions into its general account to be used for

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of

America foundation.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 105 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 106 scholarships and other educational activities. 107

The registrar shall pay the contributions received	108
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the	109
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those	110

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving	495

providing such services, the school may pay for members of the	499
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those	500
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's	501
