BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

| Section 1. That section 4301.58 of the Revised Code be | 5 |
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| amended to read as follows: | 6 |
| Sec. 4301.58. (A) No person, personally or by the person's | 7 |
| clerk, agent, or employee, who is not the holder of an A permit | 8 |
| issued by the division of liquor control, in force at the time, | 9 |
| and authorizing the manufacture of beer or intoxicating liquor, | 10 |
| or who is not an agent or employee of the division authorized to | 11 |
| manufacture such beer or intoxicating liquor, shall manufacture | 12 |
| any beer or intoxicating liquor for sale, or shall manufacture | 13 |
| spirituous liquor. | 14 |
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(B) No person, personally or by the person's clerk, agent,15 or employee, who is not the holder of an A, B, C, D, E, F, G, I,16

or S permit issued by the division, in force at the time, and 17 authorizing the sale of beer, intoxicating liquor, or alcohol, 18 or who is not an agent or employee of the division or the tax 19 commissioner authorized to sell such beer, intoxicating liquor, 20 or alcohol, shall sell, keep, or possess beer, intoxicating 21 liquor, or alcohol for sale to any persons other than those 22 authorized by Chapters 4301. and 4303. of the Revised Code to 23 purchase any beer or intoxicating liquor, or sell any alcohol at 24 retail. This division does not apply to or affect the sale or 25 possession for sale of any low-alcohol beverage. 26

(C) No person, personally or by the person's clerk, agent, 27 or employee, who is the holder of a permit issued by the 28 division, shall sell, keep, or possess for sale any intoxicating 29 liquor not purchased from the division or from the holder of a 30 permit issued by the division authorizing the sale of such 31 intoxicating liquor unless the same has been purchased with the 32 special consent of the division. The division shall revoke the 33 permit of any person convicted of a violation of division (C) of 34 this section. 35

(D)(1) Division (B) of this section does not apply to or affect either of the following:

(a) The sale or possession for sale of any low-alcohol38beverage;39

(b) A nonprofit organization that gives beer or40intoxicating liquor as a prize to a participant of a fund-41raising event for the nonprofit organization, including a42raffle, provided that both of the following apply:43

(i) At the time of the fund-raising event, the nonprofit44organization does not hold a valid permit under Chapter 4303. of45

| Section 3. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency | 60 | |
| measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public | 61 | |
| peace, health, and safety. The reason for this necessity is that | 62 | |
| its enactment into law at the earliest possible time will allow | 63 | |
| nonprofit organizations to raise funds in a more timely manner, | 64 | |
