#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4/31.0/, 4/31.0/1, and 4/31.10 be	6
amended and sections 4785.01, 4785.02, 4785.03, 4785.04,	7
4785.05, 4785.06, and 4785.07 of the Revised Code be enacted to	8
read as follows:	9
Sec. 4731.07. (A) The state medical board shall keep a	10
record of its proceedings. The minutes of a meeting of the board	11
shall, on approval by the board, constitute an official record	12
of its proceedings.	13
(B) The board shall keep a register of applicants for	14
licenses and certificates issued under this chapter; licenses	15
issued under Chapters 4730., 4760., 4762., 4774., and 4778.; and	16
licenses and limited permits issued under Chapters 4759. and	17
4761 · and registrations issued under Chanter 4785 of the	1.9

Revised Code. The register shall show the name of the applicant	19
and whether the applicant was granted or refused the license,	20
certificate, or limited permit being sought.	21

With respect to applicants to practice medicine and 22 surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery, the register shall 23 show the name of the institution that granted the applicant the 24 degree of doctor of medicine or osteopathic medicine. With 25 respect to applicants to practice respiratory care, the register 26 shall show the addresses of the person's last known place of 27 business and residence, the effective date and identification 28 number of the license or limited permit, and, if applicable, the 29 name and location of the institution that granted the person's 30 degree or certificate of completion of respiratory care 31 educational requirements and the date the degree or certificate 32 of completion was issued. 33

(C) The books and records of the board shall be primafacie evidence of matters therein contained. 34

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Sec. 4731.071. The state medical board shall develop and 36 publish on its internet web site a directory containing the 37 names of, and contact information for, all persons who hold 38 current, valid certificates or, licenses, or registrations 39 issued by the board under this chapter or Chapter 4730., 4759., 40 4760., 4761., 4762., 4774., or 4778., or 4785. of the Revised 41 Code. Except as provided in section 4731.10 of the Revised Code, 42 the directory shall be the sole source for verifying that a 43 person holds a current, valid certificate—or, license, or 44 registration issued by the board. 45

Sec. 4731.10. Upon the request of a person who holds a

license—or, certificate, or registration to practice issued

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under this chapter and is seeking licensure in another state,

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the state medical board shall provide verification of the	49
person's license-or, certificate, or registration to practice	50
the person's profession in this state. The fee for such	51
verification is fifty dollars.	52
Sec. 4785.01. As used in this chapter:	53
(A) "Ambulatory surgical facility" has the same meaning as	54
in section 3702.30 of the Revised Code.	55
(B) "Hospital" means a hospital registered under section	56
3701.07 of the Revised Code.	57
(C) "National board of surgical technology and surgical	58
assisting" means the organization known by that name or its	59
successor organization.	60
(D) "National commission for certification of surgical_	61
assistants" means the organization known by that name or its	62
successor organization.	63
(E) "Surgical assistant" means an individual, other than a	64
licensed health professional, who assists in a surgical	65
procedure by engaging in one or more of the activities described	66
in section 4785.05 of the Revised Code.	67
Sec. 4785.02. (A) Except as provided in division (B) of	68
this section, no individual shall knowingly practice as a	69
surgical assistant unless the individual holds a current, valid	70
registration to practice as a surgical assistant issued under	71
this chapter.	72
(B) Division (A) of this section does not apply to any of	73
the following:	74
(1) A physician authorized under Chapter 4731. of the	75
Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic	76

medicine and surgery, or podiatric medicine and surgery;	77
(2) A physician assistant authorized under Chapter 4730.	78
of the Revised Code to practice as a physician assistant;	79
(3) A registered nurse, advanced practice registered	80
nurse, or licensed practical nurse authorized under Chapter	81
4723. of the Revised Code to practice nursing as a registered	82
nurse, advanced practice registered nurse, or licensed practical	83
nurse;	84
(4) An individual who is practicing as a surgical	85
assistant at a hospital or ambulatory surgical facility that	86
meets the requirements of section 4785.06 of the Revised Code.	87
Sec. 4785.03. (A) An individual seeking a registration to	88
practice as a surgical assistant shall file with the state	89
medical board an application in a manner prescribed by the	90
board. The application shall include all the information the	91
board considers necessary to process the application, including	92
evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant meets the	93
requirements specified in division (B) of this section.	94
(B)(1) To be eligible to receive a registration to	95
practice as a surgical assistant, an applicant shall demonstrate	96
to the board that the applicant meets all of the following	97
<pre>requirements:</pre>	98
(a) Is at least eighteen years of age;	99
(b) Has attained a high school degree or equivalent;	100
(c) Except as provided in division (B)(2) of this section,	101
is credentialed as a surgical assistant by the national board of	102
surgical technology and surgical assisting or national	103
commission for certification of surgical assistants.	104

(2) In the case of an applicant who meets all eligibility	105
requirements other than the requirement specified in division	106
(B) (1) (c) of this section, the applicant is eliqible for a	107
registration to practice as a surgical assistant if either of	108
the following apply:	109
(a) The applicant practiced as a surgical assistant at a	110
hospital or ambulatory surgical facility located in this state	111
during any part of the six months that preceded the effective	112
date of this section.	113
(b) The applicant successfully completed a training	114
program for surgical assistants operated by a branch of the	115
United States armed forces.	116
(C) The board shall review all applications received under	117
this section. After receiving an application it considers	118
complete, the board shall determine whether the applicant meets	119
the requirements for a registration to practice as a surgical	120
assistant.	121
Sec. 4785.04. If the state medical board determines under	122
section 4785.03 of the Revised Code that an applicant meets the	123
requirements for a registration to practice as a surgical_	124
assistant, the secretary board shall issue the registration to	125
the applicant. The registration shall be valid for a two-year	126
period unless revoked or suspended, shall expire on the date	127
that is two years after the date of issuance, and may be renewed	128
for additional two-year periods in accordance with rules adopted	129
under section 4785.07 of the Revised Code.	130
Sec. 4785.05. An individual who holds a current, valid	131
registration to practice as a surgical assistant may assist a	132
physician in the performance of surgical procedures by engaging	133

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in one or more of the following activities:	134
(A) Providing exposure;	135
(B) Maintaining hemostasis;	136
(C) Performing one or more of the following tasks:	137
(1) Making incisions;	138
(2) Closing or suturing surgical sites;	139
(3) Manipulating or removing tissue;	140
(4) Implanting surgical devices or drains;	141
(5) Suctioning surgical sites;	142
(6) Placing catheters;	143
(7) Clamping or cauterizing vessels or tissues;	144
(8) Applying dressings to surgical sites;	145
(9) Injecting or administering anesthetics;	146
(10) Any other tasks as directed by the physician.	147
Sec. 4785.06. (A) Subject to division (B) of this section,	148

(6) Placing catheters;	143
(7) Clamping or cauterizing vessels or tissues;	144
(8) Applying dressings to surgical sites;	145
(9) Injecting or administering anesthetics;	146
(10) Any other tasks as directed by the physician.	147
Sec. 4785.06. (A) Subject to division (B) of this section,	148
an individual may practice as a surgical assistant without	149
holding a current, valid registration issued under section	150
4785.04 of the Revised Code if all of the following apply:	151
(1) The hospital or ambulatory surgical facility at which	152
the individual practices or intends to practice has submitted to	153
the state medical board, on behalf of its current and	154
prospective employees, an application for a waiver from the	155
requirement that surgical assistants be registered with the	156
board under this chapter.	157
(2) As part of the application, the hospital or facility	158

submits evidence that it is located in an area of the state that	159
experiences special health problems and physician practice	160
patterns that limit access to surgical care.	161
(3) After receiving and reviewing the application, the	162
board grants to the hospital's or facility's employees a waiver	163
from the registration requirements of this chapter.	164
(B) An individual may practice as a surgical assistant	165
without holding a current, valid registration issued under	166
section 4785.04 of the Revised Code if the individual practices	167
only at a hospital or ambulatory surgical facility that has been	168
granted a waiver under this section. When practicing as a	169
surgical assistant, the individual is subject to section 4785.05	170
of the Revised Code.	171
Sec. 4785.07. (A) The state medical board shall adopt	172
rules establishing standards and procedures for the regulation	173
of surgical assistants. The rules shall be adopted in accordance	174
with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code and shall do all of the	175
<pre>following:</pre>	176
(1) Establish application procedures and fees for the	177
registration of surgical assistants;	178
(2) Establish registration renewal procedures and fees;	179
(3) Specify the reasons for which the board may refuse to	180
issue or renew, suspend, or revoke a registration;	181
(4) Establish procedures for waiver applications submitted	182
pursuant to section 4785.06 of the Revised Code.	183
(B) In addition to the rules described in division (A) of	184
this section, the board may adopt any other rules it considers	185
necessary to implement and administer this chapter. The rules_	186

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may require applicants for registration or renewal to complete	187	
criminal records checks and continuing education hours.	188
