BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 2305.41, 2305.42, 2305.43,	6
2305.44, 2305.45, 2305.48, and 2305.49 of the Revised Code be	7
amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 2305.41. As used in sections 2305.41 to 2305.49 of	9
the Revised Code:	10
(A) "Disabled condition" means the condition of being-	11
unconscious, semiconscious, incoherent, or otherwise-	12
incapacitated to communicate.	13
(B) "Disabled person" means a person in a disabled	14
condition.	15
(C) <u>"Emergency medical service provider</u>" means an	16

individual who holds a current, valid certificate issued under	17	
section 4765.30 of the Revised Code to practice as an emergency		
medical technician-basic, emergency medical technician-		
intermediate, emergency medical technician-paramedic, or first		
responder.		
<u>(B)</u> "Emergency symbol" means the caduceus inscribed within	22	
a six-barred cross used by the American medical association to	23	
denote emergency information.	24	
(D) <u>(C)</u> "Identifying device" means an identifying	25	
bracelet, necklace, metal tag, <u>chain, other piece of jewelry,</u> or	26	
similar device bearing that meets either or both of the	27	
following:	28	
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<u>(1) Bears the emergency symbol and the medical information</u>		
needed in an emergency <u>;</u>	30	
(2) Contains a bar code or quick response code that may be	31	
scanned to determine medical information needed in an emergency.	32	
(E) (D) "Identification card" means any card containing	33	
the holder's name, type of medical condition, physician's name,	34	
and other medical information. "Identification card" does not	35	
include any license or permit issued pursuant to Chapter 4507.	36	
of the Revised Code.		
(F) "Medical practitioner"(E) "Incapacitated condition"	38	
means the condition of being unconscious, semiconscious,	39	
incoherent, or otherwise incapacitated to communicate.	40	
(F) "Incapacitated person" means a person in an	41	
incapacitated condition.	42	
<u>(G) "Physician"</u> means an individual who holds a current valid certificate issued is authorized under Chapter 4731. of	43 44	

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the Revised Code authorizing the to practice of medicine and 45 surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery. 46 (G) "Paramedic" has the meaning given in section 4765.01 47 of the Revised Code. 48 Sec. 2305.42. (A) A person who suffers from epilepsy, 49 diabetes, a cardiac condition, or any other type of illness that 50 causes temporary blackouts, semiconscious periods, or complete 51 unconsciousness, or who suffers from a condition requiring 52 specific medication or medical treatment, is allergic to certain 53 medications or items used in medical treatment, wears contact 54 lenses, has religious objections to certain forms of medication 55 or medical treatment, or is unable to communicate coherently or 56 effectively in the English language, is authorized and 57 encouraged to wear an identifying device. 58 (B) Any person may carry an identification card. 59 (C) By wearing an identifying device a person gives his 60 consent for any <u>emergency medical service provider</u>, law 61 enforcement officer, or medical practitioner physician who finds 62 him the person in a disabled an incapacitated condition to make 63 do either or both of the following: 64 (1) Make a reasonable search of his the person's clothing 65 or other effects for an identification card; 66 (2) Scan the person's identifying device, if it contains a 67 bar code or quick response code. 68 Sec. 2305.43. (A) A law enforcement officer shall make a 69 diligent effort to determine whether any disabled incapacitated 70 person he the officer finds is an epileptic or a diabetic, or 71 suffers from some other type of illness that would cause the 72

condition. Whenever feasible, this effort shall be made before

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the person is charged with a crime or taken to a place of 74 detention. 75

(B) In seeking to determine whether a disabled an 76 incapacitated person suffers from an illness, a law enforcement 77 officer may make a reasonable search for an identifying device 78 and an-identification card and, if found, may scan or examine 79 them for emergency information. The law enforcement officer may 80 not search for an identifying device or an-identification card 81 in a manner or to an extent that would appear to a reasonable 82 person in the circumstances to cause an unreasonable risk of 83 worsening the disabled incapacitated person's condition. 84

(C) A law enforcement officer who finds a disabled an
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<u>incapacitated</u> person without an identifying device or
identification card is not relieved of <u>his_the_duty</u> to that
person to make a diligent effort to ascertain the existence of
any illness causing the <u>disabled_incapacitated</u> condition.

(D) A cause of action against a law enforcement officer does not arise from <u>his</u><u>the officer's</u> making a reasonable search of the <u>disabled</u><u>incapacitated</u> person to locate an identifying device or identification card, even though the person is not wearing an identifying device or carrying an identification card.

(E) A law enforcement officer who determines or has reason 96 to believe that a disabled an incapacitated person is suffering 97 from an illness causing his the person's condition shall 98 promptly notify the person's physician, if practicable. If the 99 officer is unable to ascertain the physician's identity or to 100 communicate with him the physician, the officer shall make a 101 reasonable effort to cause the <u>disabled_incapacitated_person</u> to 102 be transported immediately to a medical practitioner physician 103

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or to a facility where medical treatment is available. If the104officer believes it unduly dangerous to move the disabled105incapacitated person, he the officer shall make a reasonable106effort to obtain the assistance of a medical practitioner an107emergency medical service provider or physician.108

Sec. 2305.44. (A) A medical practitioner or a trained109paramedic, in discharging his duty to a disabled person whom he110has undertaken to examine or treat When examining or treating an111incapacitated person, an emergency medical service provider or112physician shall make a reasonable search for an identifying113device or identification card and, if found, shall scan or114examine them for emergency information.115

(B) A cause of action against a medical practitioner or a trained paramedic an emergency medical service provider or physician does not arise from his making a reasonable search of a disabled an incapacitated person to locate an identifying device or identification card, even though the person is not wearing an identifying device or carrying an identification card.

(A) A person, other than a an emergency 123 medical service provider, law enforcement officer, medical 124 practitioner or physician, or a trained paramedic, who finds a 125 disabled an incapacitated person shall make a reasonable effort 126 to notify a an emergency medical service provider, law 127 enforcement officer, or medical practitioner physician. If a an 128 <u>emergency medical service provider</u>, law enforcement officer, or 129 medical practitioner physician is not present, a person who 130 finds a disabled an incapacitated person may do either or both 131 of the following: 1.32

(1) Make a reasonable search for an identifying device;

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(2) If the identifying device is found, make do either or	134
both of the following:	135
(a) Scan the identifying device, if it contains a bar code	136

(b) Make a reasonable search for an identification card.	138
If a device or card is located, the person making the	139
search shall attempt promptly to bring the device or card and	140
its contents to the attention of a an emergency medical service	141

(B) A cause of action does not arise from a reasonable	144
search to locate an identifying device or identification card as	
authorized by division (A) of this section.	146
