## A BILL

To allow the Ohio Public Works Commission, the Ohio	1
Water Development Authority, the Ohio	2
Environmental Protection Agency, county	3
auditors, and county recorders, during the state	4
of emergency due to COVID-19, to waive certain	5
penalties and late fees, suspend certain	6
reporting requirements, and waive electronic	7
recording fees, and to declare an emergency.	8

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. During the period of the emergency declared by	9
Executive Order 2020-01D, issued on March 9, 2020, all of the	10
following apply:	11
(A) Notwithstanding Chapter 164. of the Revised Code or	12
any other provision of law to the contrary, the Ohio Public	13
Works Commission may automatically extend project schedules. The	14
extension shall be for a duration determined by the Commission.	15
The Commission shall not provide for an extension if federal law	16
does not provide for or allow an extension regarding any	17
particular project. The Commission also may waive penalties and	18

late fees owed to the Commission from the issuance of 19
outstanding loans. 20
(B) Notwithstanding Chapter 6121. or Chapter 6123. of the 21
Revised Code or any other provision of law to the contrary, the 22
Ohio Water Development Authority may waive penalties and late 23
fees owed to the Authority from the issuance of outstanding 24
loans. 25

(C) Notwithstanding Chapter 3734., Chapter 3745., or 26 Chapter 6119. of the Revised Code or any other provision of law 27 to the contrary, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency may 28 waive penalties or late fees owed to the Agency from the 29 issuance of outstanding loans or permits. The Agency also may 30 suspend reporting requirements for a water research recovery 31 facility or solid waste facility. 32

(D) Notwithstanding section 319.54 of the Revised Code or any other provision of law to the contrary, a county auditor may waive any electronic filing or recording fees.

(E) Notwithstanding section 317.32 of the Revised Code or
any other provision of law to the contrary, a county recorder
may waive any electronic filing or recording fees.

Section 2. This act is an emergency measure necessary for39the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and40safety. The reason for such necessity is that immediate action41is crucial to protecting the public health during an outbreak of42COVID-19. Therefore, this act goes into immediate effect.43
