A BILL

To enact section 3701.035 of the Revised Code	1
regarding hand hygiene education for patients	2
and residents of health care facilities.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3701.035 of the Revised Code be	4
enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3701.035. (A) As used in this section, "health care	6
facility" means all of the following:	7
(1) A hospital, as defined in section 3727.01 of the	8
Revised Code;	9
(2) A nursing home, as defined in section 3721.01 of the	10
Revised Code;	11
(3) A residential care facility, as defined in section	12
3721.01 of the Revised Code;	13
(4) Any other type of health care facility that the	14
director of health determines should be subject to the	15
requirements of this section.	16

(B) The department of health shall establish and provide	17
to all health care facilities educational materials and	18
guidelines regarding patient and resident hand hygiene for the	19
patients and residents of health care facilities. The	20
educational materials and guidelines shall include appropriate	21
hand-hygiene procedures that patients and residents are	22
encouraged to practice while at a health care facility. The	23
department shall design the educational materials and guidelines	24
in a manner that makes them convenient, accessible, culturally	25
appropriate, and tailored to different groups of patients and	26
residents. To fulfill this requirement, the department shall do	27
all of the following:	28
(1) Establish different educational materials and	29
guidelines for different groups of patients and residents,	30
including all of the following groups:	31

(a) Patients and residents of different types of health	32
<u>care facilities;</u>	33
(b) Patients and residents who speak different languages;	34
(c) Individuals with functional and sensory limitations.	35
(2) Write the educational materials and guidelines in a	36
manner easily understood by individuals with not more than a	37
fourth grade education;	38
(3) Style the educational materials and guidelines in an	39
appropriate, visible font.	40
(C)(1) Except as provided in division (C)(2) of this	41
section, each health care facility shall make available to its	42
patients and residents all of the following:	43
(a) The educational materials and guidelines regarding	44

patient and resident hand hygiene that the department provides	45
the facility under this section;	46
(b) Appropriate hand hygiene products and wash facilities_	47
that enable the patients and residents to carry out the hand-	48
hygiene procedures included in the educational materials and	49
guidelines at the following times:	50
(i) At meal times;	51
(ii) When entering and exiting an area of the facility	52
where patient care is provided;	53
(iii) Before and after touching a wound or medical device;	54
(iv) After coughing or sneezing;	55
(v) After urinating or a bowel movement, regardless of	56
whether done using a bathroom, urinal, bed pan, bedside commode,	57
or other device.	58
(c) In the case of its patients and residents who have a	59
physical or mental health condition that interferes with their	60
ability to carry out on their own the hand hygiene procedures	61
included in the educational materials and guidelines, health	62
care staff who will assist the patient or resident in carrying	63
out the procedures.	64
(2) A health care facility is not required to comply with	65
divisions (C)(1)(a) and (b) of this section for the following	66
patients or residents:	67
(a) Those who are incapacitated;	68
(b) Those who are initially admitted to an emergency	69
department.	70
(D) The director of health shall adopt rules as necessary	71
