#### A BILL

To enact section 3333.93 of the Revised Code to	1
require the Chancellor of Higher Education to	2
create a template for workforce-education	3
partnership programs.	4

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3333.93 of the Revised Code be	5
enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3333.93. (A) As used in this section, "college or	7
university" means both of the following:	8
(1) A state institution of higher education as defined in	9
section 3345.011 of the Revised Code.	10
(2) A private college as defined in section 3365.01 of the Revised Code.	11 12
(B) A college or university and employers may establish a	13
workforce-education partnership program to provide assistance to	14

students to allow the students to graduate from the college or	15
university with no student loan indebtedness. The chancellor of	16
higher education shall create a template for a college or	17
university and employers to use to establish a program. The	18
chancellor shall consult with state and local workforce and	19
economic development agencies to develop the template and	20
include all of the following in the template:	21
(1) The process for an employer to participate in the	22
program;	23
(2) A requirement that, to be eligible to participate in	24
the program, a student be enrolled in a degree-granting program	25
at a college or university on at least a half-time basis, as	26
determined by the chancellor, and be a paid employee of an	27
employer participating in the program;	28
(3) The process for an eligible student under division (B)	29
(2) of this section to enroll in the program;	30
(4) Guidance for the college or university to designate a	31
mentor to assist students within the college or university;	32
(5) Guidance for an employer to designate a mentor to	33
assist students at the employer's workplace;	34
(6) Guidance for the college or university and employers	35
to create a process to make a housing stipend available to	36
students enrolled in the program;	37
(7) Guidance for the college or university and employers	38
to make life management and professional skills training	39
available to students enrolled in the program;	40
(8) A requirement that an employer establish an	41
educational assistance program pursuant to section 127 of the	42

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"Internal Revenue Code of 1986," 26 U.S.C. 127 and provide	43
tuition assistance for a student enrolled at the college or	44
university while working for the employer, up to the maximum	45
amount that the employer may exclude from the employer's gross	46
<pre>income under that section;</pre>	47
(9) A requirement that the college or university work with	48
students enrolled in the program to ensure that the students	49
have applied for and are receiving the maximum amount of	50
financial aid, in the form of scholarships and grants, that the	51
students are eligible to receive to cover the student's costs to	52
attend the college or university;	53
(10) A requirement that the college or university and	54
employers seek out additional sources of funding to cover any	55
remaining costs to attend the college or university that are not	56
covered under divisions (B)(8) and (9) of this section for	57
students enrolled in the program.	58
(C) The chancellor shall evaluate the effectiveness of the	59
workforce-education partnership programs established under this	60
section to determine whether additional training and employment_	61

programs may use the template created in division (B) of this

section to establish a workforce-education partnership program.

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
