BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3902.30 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3902.30. (A) As used in this section:	7
(1) "Health benefit plan," "health care services," and	8
"health plan issuer" have the same meanings as in section	9
3922.01 of the Revised Code.	
(2) "Health care professional" means any of the following:	11
(a) A physician licensed under Chapter 4731. of the	12
Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic	13
medicine and surgery, or podiatric medicine and surgery;	14
(b) A physician assistant licensed under Chapter 4731. of	15
the Revised Code;	16

(c) An advanced practice registered nurse as defined in	17	
section 4723.01 of the Revised Code.		
(3) "Health care services provider" means a physician,	19	
psychologist, nurse practitioner, or other health care	20	
practitioner licensed, accredited, or certified to perform	21	
health care services consistent with state law.	22	
(4) "In-person health care services" means health care	23	
services delivered by a health care professional through the use	24	
of any communication method where the professional and patient	25	
are simultaneously present in the same geographic location.	26	
$\frac{(4)-(5)}{(5)}$ "Recipient" means a patient receiving health care	27	
services or a health care professional with whom the provider of	28	
health care services is consulting regarding the patient.	29	
(5) (6) "Telemedicine services" means a mode of providing	30	
health care services through synchronous or asynchronous	31	
information and communication technology by a health care	32	
professional, within the professional's scope of practice, who	33	
is located at a site other than the site where the recipient is	34	
located.	35	
(B)(1) A health benefit plan shall provide coverage for	36	
telemedicine services on the same basis and to the same extent	37	
that the plan provides coverage for the provision of in-person	38	
health care services.	39	
(2) A health benefit plan shall not exclude coverage for a	40	
service solely because it is provided as a telemedicine service.	41	
(C) A health benefit plan shall not impose any annual or	42	
lifetime benefit maximum in relation to telemedicine services		
other than such a benefit maximum imposed on all benefits		
offered under the plan.	45

(D) This section shall not be construed as doing any of	46
the following:	47
(1) Prohibiting a health benefit plan from assessing cost-	48
sharing requirements to a covered individual for telemedicine	49
services, provided that such cost-sharing requirements for	50
telemedicine services are not greater than those for comparable	
in-person health care services;	
(2) Requiring a health plan issuer to reimburse a health	53
care professional for any costs or fees associated with the	54
provision of telemedicine services that would be in addition to	55
or greater than the standard reimbursement for comparable in-	56
person health care services;	57
(3) Requiring a health plan issuer to reimburse a	58
telemedicine provider for telemedicine services at the same rate	5.9
as in-person services, except as provided in division (F) of	60
this section.	61
(E) This Except as provided in division (F) of this	62
section, this section applies to all health benefit plans	63
issued, offered, or renewed on or after January 1, 2021.	64
(F)(1)(a) During a state of emergency declared by the	65
governor of this state or the president of the United States, a	66
health plan issuer shall cover any health care service that is	67
provided as a telemedicine service if both of the following	68
apply:	69
(i) The health care service is a covered service.	70
(ii) It is determined by the health care services provider	71
that doing so is in the interest of the public.	72

this section shall be at the same rate and in the same manner as	74
if the health care service had been provided as an in-person	75
health care service.	
(2) Division (F) of this section shall not be construed as	77
doing any of the following:	78
(a) Authorizing a health care services provider to provide	79
health care services outside of the provider's legal scope of	80
<pre>practice;</pre>	81
(b) Requiring a health plan issuer to reimburse a health	82
care services provider for providing a health care service that	83
is outside of the provider's legal scope of practice;	
(c) Requiring a health plan issuer to provide	85
reimbursement for a health care service that is not a covered	86

Section 2. That existing section 3902.30 of the Revised	88
Code is hereby repealed.	89
Section 3. This act is an emergency measure necessary for	90
the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and	91
safety. The reason for such necessity is to prevent the	92
transmission of COVID-19 while providing the people of Ohio with	93
necessary access to health care services. Therefore, this act	94
shall go into immediate effect	95
