BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4729.44 of the Revised Code be	6
amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 4729.44. (A) As used in this section:	8
(1) "Board of health" means a board of health of a city or	9
general health district or an authority having the duties of a	10
board of health under section 3709.05 of the Revised Code.	11
(2) "Physician" means an individual authorized under	12
Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice medicine and	13
surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, or podiatric medicine	14
and surgery.	15
(B) If use of the protocol developed pursuant to rules	16

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adopted under division (G) of this section has been authorized	17
under section 3707.56 or 4731.942 of the Revised Code, a	18
pharmacist or pharmacy intern may dispense naloxone without a	19
prescription to either of the following in accordance with that	
<pre>protocol:</pre>	
(1) An individual who there is reason to believe is	22
experiencing or at risk of experiencing an opioid-related	
overdose;	
(2) A family member, friend, or other individual in a	25
position to assist an individual who there is reason to believe	26
is at risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose.	27
(C) A pharmacist or pharmacy intern who dispenses naloxone	28
under this section shall instruct the individual to whom	29
naloxone is dispensed to summon emergency services as soon as	30
practicable either before or after administering naloxone.	
(D) A pharmacist may document on a prescription form the	32
dispensing of naloxone by the pharmacist or a pharmacy intern	33
supervised by the pharmacist. The form may be assigned a number	
for record-keeping purposes.	
(E) This section does not affect the authority of a	36
pharmacist or pharmacy intern to fill or refill a prescription	37
for naloxone.	
(F) A board of health that in good faith authorizes a	39
pharmacist or pharmacy intern to dispense naloxone without a	40
prescription in accordance with a protocol developed pursuant to	41
rules adopted under division (G) of this section is not liable	42
for or subject to any of the following for any action or	43
omission of the individual to whom the naloxone is dispensed:	44

damages in any civil action, prosecution in any criminal

All rules adopted under this section shall be adopted in	67
accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code.	68
(H) (1) The state board of pharmacy shall develop a program	69
to educate all of the following about the authority of a	70
pharmacist or pharmacy intern to dispense naloxone without a

(a) Holders of licenses issued under this chapter that	73

engage in the sale or dispensing of naloxone pursuant to this

(b) Registered pharmacy technicians, certified pharmacy	76
technicians, and pharmacy technician trainees registered under	77
this chapter who engage in the sale of naloxone pursuant to this	78

(c) Individuals who are not licensed or registered under	80
this chapter but are employed by license holders described in	81
division (H)(1)(a) of this section.	82
(2) As part of the program, the board also shall educate	83
the license holders, pharmacy technicians, and employees	84
described in division (H)(1) of this section about maintaining	85
an adequate supply of naloxone and methods for determining a	86
pharmacy's stock of the drug.	87
(3) The board may use its web site to share information	88
under the program.	89
Section 2. That existing section 4729.44 of the Revised	90
Code is hereby repealed.	91
