On behalf of our over 830 dealer members, we are writing today to urge your support of House Bill 606 (Grendell), which would provide immunity from unwarranted legal action for businesses, including employees, who in good faith are attempting to comply with federal and state guidelines during a state of emergency.

By way of introduction, our dealer members employ thousands in Ohio and play a key role in both the local and state economies as it relates to tax collection and remittance. The majority of our dealerships are family owned and remain very active on both the charitable and civic fronts in their local communities.
