Dear Co-Chairmen Oelslager and Callender and Members of the House Finance Committee,

I am writing to you once again on behalf of the Ohio Telecom Association (OTA) and its member companies to express concern over Amendment 2504 to HB 13, which is being considered by the House Finance Committee tomorrow. There are several aspects of this amendment which weaken the bill and distract from its primary purpose to create and fund the Ohio Residential Broadband Expansion Grant Program to bring broadband to underserved areas of Ohio.

We believe Amendment 2504 deserves more thorough discussion. It is unclear how many of the elements of this proposal will operate. For example, our member companies still have several questions about what costs are recoverable and proposed partnerships between middle mile and last mile providers, as well as how expenses can be run through a rate base to recover cost.

As internet service providers operating throughout Ohio, OTA member companies will continue our investment in Ohio's broadband network. We look forward to continuing this discussion over the next few months. We hope for full consideration of this amendment, which should enhance this important program that will provide broadband services for unserved or underserved Ohioans.

We urge your support of HB 13 and pledge to work toward improving the legislation as it makes its way through the process. Thank you for your consideration of this important legislation.
