 - Each day this week, we will be talking about Say Something's key messages. The key messages are: Look for warning signs, signals, and threats. Act immediately. Take it seriously, and Say Something to a trusted adult. Hopefully, at the end of this week, we will all know how to make a difference for someone else.
 - Monday: All students are encouraged to wear GREEN. Green is the color of Sandy Hook Promise. Announcements will be read each morning during this week. Say Something messages will be displayed on the monitors in the cafetorium.
 - Tuesday: Evan Video Day Have students watch the Evan video and facilitate a discussion about the signs displayed in the video. The link to the video is below: <u>https://youtu.be/hcakXUnXVew</u>
 - Have students create a video, piece of art, or write a poem that represents the primary themes of the Evan video. Display the student work throughout the studios to promote the *Say Something* program.
 - Wednesday: Pledge to Say Something Day Have students sign a pledge to Say Something if they see warning signs, signals, and threats.
 - Thursday: Trusted Adult Day Teachers and staff members will sign a banner letting kids know that they are a trusted adult.
 - Friday: Say Something Wall Have students write names on a banner of people that they care about.
- Secondary (Tier 2, Targeted) Reducing the frequency and intensity of incidents of problem behaviors for students who are not responsive to primary intervention practices by providing more focused, intensive, and frequent small group-oriented responses in situations where problem behavior is likely.
