Chairman Jones, Vice Chairwoman Manchester, Ranking Member Robinson, and my colleagues on the House Primary and Secondary Education Committee, thank you for allowing me to give testimony on House Resolution 266.

House Resolution 266 urges the Ohio Department of Education to institute a mandatory fouryear life skills program. As outlined in the resolution, basic life skills include cooking, cleaning, budgeting, home repair, parenting, balancing a check book, and filing taxes.
