I am strongly opposed to HB 680. I would have preferred to testify in person but given the pandemic and my age, 71, I do not feel safe coming in to testify in a small room. I am aware than fewer than one-quarter of eligible Ohio votes participated in the recent primary election. Part of the reason for this distressingly small turnout was the confusion and difficulty that arose from rules concerning absentee voting. HB 680 will make that confusion and difficulty much worse. It prevents the Secretary of State from performing his duties, reduces the availability of early voting, and disenfranchises people who do not have a computer printer because absentee ballot applications are not allowed to be sent digitally. I urge legislators to return to a system where ballot applications are sent out by the Secretary of State to all eligible voters and where postage is paid for by the state, not the individual. In a time of pandemic, pushing more people to choose between voting in person, which may sacrifice their health, or not voting at all is immoral. Disenfranchisement should never be a goal of a legislator. In fact, making voting both safe and easy is the moral duty of every legislator.
