My name is Meg Brown an Ohioan and avid voter. I am fervently against HB6 and I appreciate the time to tell you why.

HB6 should have been struck down even before the corruption and bribery. With more than \$1.3 billion being funneled from consumers to bailout FEnergy Harbor, the legislation has no requirement or promise that the plants would stay open or that employees would be protected. They could receive this money and still leave employees without jobs, with higher energy bills, and during an economic downturn.
