## **RE: House Bill 614: OMA Interested Party Written Testimony**

Dear Chairman Coley,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written interested party testimony on House Bill 614. House Bill 614 begins the important work of comprehensively reviewing Ohio's unemployment compensation system in an effort to create a more efficient and effective system for both employers and employees.

The Social Security Act of 1935 (SSA) created a federal-state unemployment insurance (UI) program to (1.) provide temporary, partial wage replacement to individuals out of work, generally through no fault of their own, and (2.) promote economic stability by maintaining a steady flow of dollars throughout the economy even when there is widespread unemployment.

Since the 1930s Ohio's system has seen a variety of major adaptations as society's needs have changed. It is important to continue to review the system to ensure it operates optimally for the employers and employees who rely on it.

COVID-19 has provided unprecedented challenges for the filing and delivering of benefits. Historic unemployment due to the pandemic has exacerbated problems that have long festered in the system. This bill provides an opportunity to holistically review and improve Ohio's unemployment compensation system.

The OMA has consistently advocated for comprehensive administrative and solvency reforms and we're encouraged that Ohio is embarking on this process. How the system administratively functions is as important as the solvency of the system.
