Chairman Manning,

On behalf of the Ohio Propane Gas Association, I write to express our support for House Concurrent Resolution 8, requesting Congress to urge the Director of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) to revise the crash indictor standards for commercial fleet drivers.

Currently, company fleet drivers can be designated as high risk and even face forced termination in incidences where an accident occurs and it is NOT their fault. This nonsensical provision can force companies to pay more to insure drivers and even worse, force them to layoff good employees. Revising the crash indictor standards so that drivers are only reprimanded in instances where a crash occurs and it has been deemed their fault would benefit propane marketers by giving them certainty when handling safety issues with their commercial fleets. Additionally, it would ensure safety standards are maintained while also avoiding the unnecessary punishment of drivers who have sustained a good record of safety throughout their tenure.

In closing, we applaud Senator Schaffer for bringing this legislation forward and urge members of the committee to support its passage.
