Dear Committee members,

I am writing today as a representative of Past Plastic Cincinnati. Our coalition includes: the League of Women Voters of Cincinnati Area, Sierra Club (Miami Group), Womens' City Club of Greater Cincinnati, Leaders for Environmental Awareness and Protection (LEAP), Communities United for Action (CUFA), Environmental Community Organization (ECO), Community Earth Alliance, Limestone Law & Policy Advocates, St. John's Universalist Unitarian Church Green Sanctuary, Enright Ridge Urban Ecovillage, Imago Earth Center, First Unitarian Church Social Justice Committee, Vegan Earth, Church of Our Savoir Episcopal Church, Shomrei Olam, and the Mill Creek Alliance.

We are citizens of Ohio who are concerned about our environment and the harm caused by single-use plastic take-away containers. First and foremost, we are cognizant of the reality that these plastic items will not breakdown over time or ever "go away". Sadly, the inability of the public to effectively recycle these items results in a loss to our environment, especially our waterways and the world's oceans. It is a health threat not only to sea turtles and fish, but also to humanity.
