A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To recognize	Jerusalem	as	the	capital	of	the	1
State of I	srael.						2

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, Ohio is Israel's twenty-eighth largest trading	3
partner and nearly one hundred fifty thousand Ohio residents are	4
of the Jewish faith; and	5
WHEREAS, Ohio holds more Israeli bonds than any other	6
governmental entity in the world; and	7
WHEREAS, Archaeological digs have uncovered Jewish heritage	8
inside Jerusalem and across the land of Israel dating back to at	9
least three thousand years ago; and	10
WHEREAS, The government of Israel retained sovereign	11
control over the entire city of Jerusalem on June 7, 1967; and	12
WHEREAS, From 1948 to 1967, Jerusalem was a divided city	13
and Israeli citizens of all faiths as well as Jewish citizens of	14
all states were denied access to holy sites in the area	15
controlled by Jordan, but after 1967, Jerusalem has been a	16
united city administered by Israel, and persons of all religious	17

faiths have been guaranteed full access to holy sites within the 18 19 city; and WHEREAS, Jerusalem is the residence of the Knesset, the 20 Supreme Court, the Prime Minister, the National Bank, and other 21 federal government buildings, and recognizing Jerusalem as the 22 capital of the State of Israel would provide for efficacy of 23 diplomacy; and 24 WHEREAS, Each sovereign nation under international law and 25 custom may designate its own capital, and furthermore, the 26 United States of America maintains its embassy in the 27 functioning capital of every country except in the case of our 28 democratic friend and strategic ally, the State of Israel; and 29 WHEREAS, On October 24, 1995, the 104th United States 30 Congress passed the bipartisan Jerusalem Embassy Act of 1995 31 which was overwhelmingly adopted by the Senate (93-5) and the 32 House of Representatives (374-37), which recognized Jerusalem as 33 the capital of Israel and ordered the relocation of the United 34 States embassy to Jerusalem by no later than May 31, 1999; and 35 WHEREAS, On June 5, 2017, United States Senate Resolution 36 167 relating to the recognition of Jerusalem as the capital of 37 Israel and the relocation of the United States embassy to 38 Jerusalem passed by a unanimous 90-0 vote; and 39 WHEREAS, On December 6, 2017, the President of the United 40

States of America officially recognized Jerusalem as the capital of the State of Israel; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 133rd General43Assembly of the State of Ohio, in adopting this concurrent44resolution, honor this auspicious occasion and formally45recognize the city of Jerusalem as the official capital of the46State of Israel; and be it further47
