BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, The United States Government Accountability Office	4		
has found that, in recent years, an increasing number of	5		
prescription drugs, including life-saving and life-sustaining	6		
drugs, have been in short supply, preventing patients and their	7		
health care providers from accessing medications that are	8		
essential for treatment; and	9		
WHEREAS, Drug shortages adversely impact patient care by	10		
causing the substitution of safe and effective medications with	11		
alternative drugs and by compromising or delaying medical	12		
treatment and procedures; and	13		
WHEREAS, Drug shortages also increase health care costs and	14		
burden health care providers and facilities by requiring the use	15		
of more expensive drugs as substitutes and by diverting staff			
away from direct patient care in order to manage these	17		

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shortages; and	18
WHEREAS, It has been reported that drug shortages result	19
from many factors, including difficulties in acquiring raw	20
materials, manufacturing problems, regulatory issues, and	21
business decisions, as well as many other disturbances within	22
the drug supply chain; and	23
WHEREAS, While shortages affect a variety of prescription	24
drugs, it has been documented that certain types are more	25
vulnerable than others, including generic drugs, oncology	26
medications, and injectable drugs; now therefore be it	27
RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 133rd General Assembly	28
of the State of Ohio, urge Congress and the Food and Drug	29
Administration to enhance methods and procedures for monitoring	30
and assessing risks to the supply of critical drugs, including by	31
requiring drug manufacturers to notify the Food and Drug	32
Administration of any drug discontinuances or manufacturing	33
interruptions likely to result in disturbances within the supply	34
chain, to take action to ensure patient access to important	35
medications, to establish incentives to encourage the production	36
of drugs at risk of shortages, and to introduce any necessary	37
safeguards to prevent future drug shortages; and be it further	38
RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives	39
transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the	40
Commissioner of Food and Drugs, each member of the Ohio	41
Congressional delegation, and the news media of the Ohio.	42
