BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 be amended	7
and sections 3314.0310 and 3326.091 of the Revised Code be	8
enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3313.60. Notwithstanding division (D) of section	10
3311.52 of the Revised Code, divisions (A) to (E) of this	11
section do not apply to any cooperative education school	12
district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of section	13
3311.52 of the Revised Code.	14
(A) The board of education of each city, exempted village,	15

and local school district and the board of each cooperative	16
education school district established, pursuant to section	17
3311.521 of the Revised Code, shall prescribe a curriculum for	18
all schools under its control. Except as provided in division	19
(E) of this section, in any such curriculum there shall be	20
included the study of the following subjects:	21
(1) The language arts, including reading, writing,	22
spelling, oral and written English, and literature;	23
(2) Geography, the history of the United States and of	24
Ohio, and national, state, and local government in the United	25
States, including a balanced presentation of the relevant	26
contributions to society of men and women of African, Mexican,	27
Puerto Rican, and American Indian descent as well as other	28
ethnic and racial groups in Ohio and the United States;	29
(3) Mathematics;	30
(4) Natural science, including instruction in the	31
conservation of natural resources;	32
(5) Health education, which shall include instruction in:	33
(a) The nutritive value of foods, including natural and	34
organically produced foods, the relation of nutrition to health,	35
and the use and effects of food additives;	36
(b) The harmful effects of and legal restrictions against	37
the use of drugs of abuse, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco;	38
(c) Venereal disease education, except that upon written	39
request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be	40
excused from taking instruction in venereal disease education;	41
(d) <u>In grades kindergarten through six</u> , annual age-	42
appropriate instruction in child sexual abuse prevention,	43

Each school district shall notify the parents and legal quardians of students who receive instruction related to dating violence prevention and sexual violence prevention, as described under divisions (A)(5)(d) and (f) of this section, that such instruction is a required part of the district's curriculum.

Notification shall include that upon request, parents and legal quardians may examine such instructional materials in accordance with this section.

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If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than eighteen years of age submits to the principal of the student's school a written request to examine the dating violence prevention and sexual violence prevention instruction materials

used at that school, the principal, within a reasonable period	73
of time after the request is made, shall allow the parent or	74
guardian to examine those materials at that school.	75
(f) (g) Prescription opioid abuse prevention, with an	76
emphasis on the prescription drug epidemic and the connection	77
between prescription opioid abuse and addiction to other drugs,	
such as heroin;	79
(g) (h) The process of making an anatomical gift under	80
Chapter 2108. of the Revised Code, with an emphasis on the life-	81
saving and life-enhancing effects of organ and tissue donation.	82
(6) Physical education;	83
(7) The fine arts, including music;	84
(8) First aid, including a training program in	85
cardiopulmonary resuscitation, which shall comply with section	86
3313.6021 of the Revised Code when offered in any of grades nine	87
through twelve, safety, and fire prevention. However, upon	88
written request of the student's parent or guardian, a student	89
shall be excused from taking instruction in cardiopulmonary	90
resuscitation.	91
(B) Except as provided in division (E) of this section,	92
every school or school district shall include in the	93
requirements for promotion from the eighth grade to the ninth	94
grade one year's course of study of American history. A board	95
may waive this requirement for academically accelerated students	96
who, in accordance with procedures adopted by the board, are	97
able to demonstrate mastery of essential concepts and skills of	98
the eighth grade American history course of study.	99
(C) As specified in divisions (B)(6) and (C)(6) of section	100
3313.603 of the Revised Code, except as provided in division (E)	101

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of this section, every high school shall include in the 102 requirements for graduation from any curriculum one-half unit 103 each of American history and government. 104

- (D) Except as provided in division (E) of this section, 105 basic instruction or demonstrated mastery in geography, United 106 States history, the government of the United States, the 107 government of the state of Ohio, local government in Ohio, the 108 Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, and 109 the Constitution of the state of Ohio shall be required before 110 pupils may participate in courses involving the study of social 111 problems, economics, foreign affairs, United Nations, world 112 government, socialism, and communism. 113
- (E) For each cooperative education school district established pursuant to section 3311.521 of the Revised Code and each city, exempted village, and local school district that has territory within such a cooperative district, the curriculum adopted pursuant to divisions (A) to (D) of this section shall only include the study of the subjects that apply to the grades operated by each such school district. The curriculums for such schools, when combined, shall provide to each student of these districts all of the subjects required under divisions (A) to (D) of this section.
- (F) The board of education of any cooperative education school district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of section 3311.52 of the Revised Code shall prescribe a curriculum for the subject areas and grade levels offered in any school under its control.
- (G) Upon the request of any parent or legal guardian of a 129 student, the board of education of any school district shall 130 permit the parent or guardian to promptly examine, with respect 131

to the parent's or guardian's own child:	132
(1) Any survey or questionnaire, prior to its	133
administration to the child;	134
(2) Any textbook, workbook, software, video, or other	135
instructional materials being used by the district in connection	136
with the instruction of the child;	137
(3) Any completed and graded test taken or survey or	138
questionnaire filled out by the child;	139
(4) Copies of the statewide academic standards and each	140
model curriculum developed pursuant to section 3301.079 of the	141
Revised Code, which copies shall be available at all times	142
during school hours in each district school building.	143
Sec. 3314.0310. (A) If a community school serves students	144
in any of grades kindergarten through six, the school's	145

submits to the principal of the student's school a written	156
request to examine the sexual violence prevention education	157
instruction materials used at that school, the principal, within	158
a reasonable period of time after the request is made, shall	159
allow the parent or quardian to examine those materials at that	160

(3) Each community school shall notify the parents and	162
legal guardians of students who receive instruction related to	163
dating violence prevention and sexual violence prevention, as	164
described in this section, that such instruction is a required	165
part of the school's curriculum. Notification shall include that	166
upon request, parents and legal guardians may examine such	167
instructional materials in accordance with division (B)(2) of	168

Sec. 3319.073. (A) The board of education of each city and	170
exempted village school district and the governing board of each	171
educational service center shall adopt or adapt the curriculum	172
developed by the department of education for, or shall develop	173
in consultation with public or private agencies or persons	174
involved in child abuse prevention or intervention programs, a	175
program of in-service training in the prevention of child abuse,	176
violence, and substance abuse and the promotion of positive	177
youth development. Each person employed by any school district	178
or service center to work in a school as a nurse, teacher,	179
counselor, school psychologist, or administrator shall complete	180
at least four hours of the in-service training within two years	181
of commencing employment with the district or center, and every	182
five years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school	183
district or service center to work in an elementary school as a	184
nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator	185
on March 30, 2007, shall complete at least four hours of the in-	186
service training not later than March 30, 2009, and every five	187
years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school	188
district or service center to work in a middle or high school as	189

a nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or

administrator on October 16, 2009, shall complete at least four

hours of the in-service training not later than October 16, 192
2011, and every five years thereafter. 193

- (B) Each board shall incorporate training in school safety 194 and violence prevention, including human trafficking content, 195 into the in-service training required by division (A) of this 196 section. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or adapt the 197 curriculum developed by the department or shall develop its own 198 curriculum in consultation with public or private agencies or 199 persons involved in school safety and violence prevention 200 201 programs.
- (C) Each board shall incorporate training on the board's 202 harassment, intimidation, or bullying policy adopted under 203 section 3313.666 of the Revised Code into the in-service 204 training required by division (A) of this section. Each board 205 also shall incorporate training in the prevention of dating 206 violence into the in-service training required by that division 207 for middle and high school employees. The board shall develop 208 its own curricula for these purposes. 209
- (D) Each board shall incorporate training in youth suicide 210 awareness and prevention into the in-service training required 211 by division (A) of this section for each person employed by a 212 school district or service center to work in a school as a 213 nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or 214 administrator, and any other personnel that the board determines 215 appropriate. The board shall require each such person to undergo 216 training in youth suicide awareness and prevention programs once 217 every two years. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or 218 adapt the curriculum developed by the department or shall 219 develop its own curriculum in consultation with public or 220 private agencies or persons involved in youth suicide awareness 221

and prevention programs.	
The training completed under this division shall count	223
toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional	224
development required by the school district or service center	225
board, and the training may be accomplished through self-review	226
of suitable suicide prevention materials approved by the board.	227
(E) Each board shall incorporate training on child sexual	228
abuse into the in-service training required by division (A) of	229
this section. The training completed under this division shall	230
count toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional	231
development required by the school district or service center	232
board.	233
Sec. 3326.091. (A) If a STEM school serves students in any	234
of grades kindergarten through six, the school's curriculum for	235
that grade shall include annual age-appropriate instruction in	236
child sexual abuse prevention, including information on	237
available counseling and resources for children who are sexually	238

(B)(1) If a STEM school serves students in any of grades	240
seven through twelve, the school's curriculum for those grades	241
shall include age-appropriate instruction in sexual violence	242
prevention education.	243
(2) If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than	244
eighteen years of age who is attending a STEM school submits to	245
the principal of the student's school a written request to	246
examine the sexual violence prevention education instruction	247
materials used at that school, the principal, within a	248
reasonable period of time after the request is made, shall allow	249
the parent or quardian to examine those materials at that	250

school.	251
(3) Each STEM school shall notify the parents and legal	252
guardians of students who receive instruction related to dating	253
violence prevention and sexual violence prevention, as described	254
under this section, that such instruction is a required part of	255
the school's curriculum. Notification shall include that upon	256
request, parents and legal guardians may examine such	257
instructional materials in accordance with division (B)(2) of	258
this section.	259
