# A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.507 of the Revised Code to create "The Ohio	2
Aerospace Institute" license plate.	3

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.507 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495,	10

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	34
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	35
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	36
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	37
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	38
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	39
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	40
cancer partenes and that improve access for such partenes to	40

quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of41the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or42other abortion-related activities.43

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar44receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the45organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall46deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that47organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend48the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same49

manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 50 other money in that fund. 51 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 52 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 53 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 54 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 55 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 57 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 58 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 59 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 60 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 61 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 62 directly to their clients. 63 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64

receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar69receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the70Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the71contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social72support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 75 St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 76 its research and other programs. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 79 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 80 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 82 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 83 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 84 contributions for its research and other programs. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 87 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 88 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 89 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 92 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 93 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 94 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 96 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 97 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 98 contributions into its general account to be used for 99 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 100 America foundation. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar102receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the1034-H youth development program of the Ohio state university104extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay105the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.106

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 107

pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio108cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for109scholarships and other educational activities.110

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 111 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 112 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 113 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 114 that organization. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar116receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to117Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for118scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or119events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.120

The registrar shall pay the contributions received121pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio122aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to123facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational124programming.125

The registrar shall pay the contributions received126pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the127organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that128organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in129need.130

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 131 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 132 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 133 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 134

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar135receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the136

university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 137 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 138 section. A university or college that receives contributions 139 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 140 scholarship fund. 141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio cyclists of all ages.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 157 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 158 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 159 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 160 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 161 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 164 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 165 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 166

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lighthouses of fairport harbor.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar168receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the169Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the170contributions only to promote and support the football team of171Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 174 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 175 four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 176 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 177 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 178 sponsors within this state. 179

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 187 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 188 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 189 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 190 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar192receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the193Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it194receives under this section to provide educational scholarships195

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to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 196 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 197 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 198 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 199 the improvement of patient outcomes. 200

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 201 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 202 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 203 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 204 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 205 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 206 personnel, veterans, and their families. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

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The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 226 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 227 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 228 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 229 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 230 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 231 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 232 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 233 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 234 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 235 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 240 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 241 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 242 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 243 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 244 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 245 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 246 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 247 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 248 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 249 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 250 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 251 under this section. 252

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar253receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the254Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use255

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the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 256 programs. 257

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar258receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the259western reserve historical society, which shall use the260contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.261

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar262receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the263Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple264negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the265contributions for charitable and educational purposes.266

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar267receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the268central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities,269which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the270Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory271the person who paid the contribution resides.272

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 273 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 274 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 275 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 276 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 277 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 278 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 279 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 280 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 281 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 282 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 283 such payments are to be made. 284 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 285 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 286 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 287 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 288 river watershed. 289

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar302receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the303girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the304contributions to support the activities of the organization.305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 306 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 307 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 308 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 309 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 310 local beekeeping programs. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar312receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the313

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national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 314
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 315
legends to inspire future leaders. 316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 318 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 319 the contributions for educational purposes. 320

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar321receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the322Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the323contributions to support the activities of the organization.324

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 325 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 326 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 327 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 328 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 329 commission and that is participating in the license plate 330 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 331 of the county of residence of an applicant. 332

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 333 contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 334 the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 335 that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 336 participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 337 (G) of that section. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar339receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to340pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program,341which shall use the contributions for the protection and342

Ohio and for educational programs. 344 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 346 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 347 supporting cancer research. 348 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 350 351 Stan Hywet hall and gardens. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352 receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 353 Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 354 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 355 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 356 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 357 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 358 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 359 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 361 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 362 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 363 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 364 365 scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar366receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the367Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council368shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner369throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.370

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 371

receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 372 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 373 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar375receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the376Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,377which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 380 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 381 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 382 charitable purposes. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 385 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 386 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 387 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 390 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 391 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 392 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 393 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 394 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 395

The registrar shall pay the contributions received396pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio397concerns of police survivors, which shall use those398contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate399to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed400

in the line of duty.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received402pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater403Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those404contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in405the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.406

The registrar shall pay the contributions received407pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio408association of chiefs of police.409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 411 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 412 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 413 families. 414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 420 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 421 422 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 423 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 424 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 425 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 426 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 427 participating in that program. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 429

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receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 430 Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 431 contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar433receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the434Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,435which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and436advocacy purposes throughout the state.437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 438 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 439 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 440 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 441 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 442 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 443 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 444 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 445 lives to the fullest. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar447receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to448Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the449contributions into its general account to be used for purposes450of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.451

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar452receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the453Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to454commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in455Cleveland, Ohio.456

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar457receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the458

central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research459foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the460chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose461geographic territory the person who paid the contribution462resides.463

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting law enforcement education and assistance.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar469receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the470Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the471moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section4724503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written473agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.474

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar475receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the476rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,477Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and478used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the479rotary foundation.480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar481receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the482Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the483contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained484under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.485

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar486receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to487

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buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 488 contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 489

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar490receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the491municipal corporation of Twinsburg.492

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 493 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 494 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 495 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 496 connection. 497

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar498receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the499Medina county historical society, which shall use those500contributions to distribute between the various historical501societies and museums in Medina county.502

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1045 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1046 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1047 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1048 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1049 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1050 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1051 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1052

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1053receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1054Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1055corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1056contributions for any political purpose.1057

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1058receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1059Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1060Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1061any political purpose.1062

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1064 Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1065 high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1066 purpose. 1067

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1068receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1069friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1070to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1071emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1072

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1073receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1074Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1075activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the1076city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."1077

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1078 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1079 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1080 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1081 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1082 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1083 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1084 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1085
