A BILL

To amend sections 4731.07 and 4731.071 and to enact	1
sections 4785.01, 4785.02, 4785.03, 4785.04,	2
4785.05, 4785.06, 4785.07, and 4785.08 of the	3
Revised Code to regulate the practice of	4
surgical assistants.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4731.07 and 4731.071 be amended	6
and sections 4785.01, 4785.02, 4785.03, 4785.04, 4785.05,	7
4785.06, 4785.07, and 4785.08 of the Revised Code be enacted to	8
read as follows:	9
Sec. 4731.07. (A) The state medical board shall keep a	10
record of its proceedings. The minutes of a meeting of the board	11
shall, on approval by the board, constitute an official record	12
of its proceedings.	13
(B) The board shall keep a register of applicants for	14
licenses and certificates issued under this chapter; licenses	15
issued under Chapters 4730., 4760., 4762., 4774., and 4778. <u>, and</u>	16
4785.; and licenses and limited permits issued under Chapters	17

4759. and 4761. of the Revised Code. The register shall show the 18 name of the applicant and whether the applicant was granted or 19 refused the license, certificate, or limited permit being sought.

With respect to applicants to practice medicine and 22 surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery, the register shall 23 show the name of the institution that granted the applicant the 24 degree of doctor of medicine or osteopathic medicine. With 25 respect to applicants to practice respiratory care, the register 26 shall show the addresses of the person's last known place of 27 business and residence, the effective date and identification 28 number of the license or limited permit, and, if applicable, the 29 name and location of the institution that granted the person's 30 degree or certificate of completion of respiratory care 31 educational requirements and the date the degree or certificate 32 of completion was issued. 33

(C) The books and records of the board shall be prima-34 facie evidence of matters therein contained. 35

Sec. 4731.071. The state medical board shall develop and 36 publish on its internet web site a directory containing the 37 names of, and contact information for, all persons who hold 38 current, valid certificates or licenses issued by the board 39 under this chapter or Chapter 4730., 4759., 4760., 4761., 4762., 40 4774., or 4778., or 4785. of the Revised Code. Except as 41 provided in section 4731.10 of the Revised Code, the directory 42 shall be the sole source for verifying that a person holds a 43 current, valid certificate or license issued by the board. 44

Sec.	4785.01.	As	used	in	this	chapter:

(A) "Ambulatory surgical facility" has the same meaning as

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in section 3702.30 of the Revised Code. 47 (B) "Hospital" means a hospital registered under section 48 3701.07 of the Revised Code. 49 (C) "National board of surgical technology and surgical 50 assisting" means the organization known by that name or its 51 successor organization. 52 (D) "National commission for certification of surgical 53 assistants" means the organization known by that name or its 54 successor organization. 55 (E) "Surgical assistant" means an individual, other than a 56 licensed health professional, who assists in a surgical 57 procedure by engaging in one or more of the activities described 58 in section 4785.05 of the Revised Code. 59 Sec. 4785.02. (A) Except as provided in division (B) of 60 this section, no individual shall knowingly practice as a 61 surgical assistant unless the individual holds a current, valid 62 license to practice as a surgical assistant issued under this 63 <u>chapter.</u> 64 (B) Division (A) of this section does not apply to any of 65 the following: 66 (1) A physician authorized under Chapter 4731. of the 67 Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic 68 medicine and surgery, or podiatric medicine and surgery; 69 (2) A physician assistant licensed under Chapter 4730. of 70 the Revised Code to practice as a physician assistant; 71 (3) A registered nurse, advanced practice registered 72 nurse, or licensed practical nurse licensed under Chapter 4723. 73

of the Revised Code to practice nursing as a registered nurse,

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advanced practice registered nurse, or licensed practical nurse;	75
(4) An individual who is practicing as a surgical	76
assistant at a hospital or ambulatory surgical facility that	77
meets the requirements of section 4785.06 of the Revised Code.	78
(C) If an individual violates division (A) of this	79
section, the board may, pursuant to an adjudication under	80
Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, impose a civil penalty. The	81
amount of the civil penalty imposed shall be determined by the	82
board in accordance with rules adopted under section 4785.08 of	83
the Revised Code.	84
Sec. 4785.03. (A) An individual seeking a license to	85
practice as a surgical assistant shall file with the state	86
medical board an application in a manner prescribed by the	87
board. The application shall include all the information the	88
board considers necessary to process the application, including	89
evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant meets the	90
requirements specified in division (B) of this section.	91
(B)(1) To be eligible to receive a license to practice as	92
a surgical assistant, an applicant shall demonstrate to the	93
board that the applicant meets all of the following	94
requirements:	95
(a) Is at least eighteen years of age;	96
(b) Has attained a high school degree or equivalent;	97
(c) Except as provided in division (B)(2) of this section,	98
is credentialed as a surgical assistant by the national board of	99
surgical technology and surgical assisting or national	100
commission for certification of surgical assistants.	101
(2) In the case of an applicant who meets all eligibility	102

requirements other than the requirement specified in division	103
(B)(1)(c) of this section, the applicant is eligible for a	104
license to practice as a surgical assistant if either of the	105
following apply:	106
(a) The applicant practiced as a surgical assistant at a	107
hospital or ambulatory surgical facility located in this state	108
during any part of the six months that preceded the effective	109
date of this section.	110
(b) The applicant successfully completed a training	111
program for surgical assistants operated by a branch of the	112
United States armed forces.	113
(C) In addition to the requirements described in division	114
(B) of this section, each applicant for licensure shall complete	115
a criminal records check in accordance with rules adopted under	116
section 4785.08 of the Revised Code. The board shall specify in	117
rules adopted under section 4785.08 of the Revised Code the	118
offenses for which an applicant will be disqualified from	119
licensure.	120
(D) The board shall review all applications received under_	121
this section. After receiving an application it considers	122
complete, the board shall determine whether the applicant meets	123
the requirements for a license to practice as a surgical	124
assistant.	125
Sec. 4785.04. (A) If the state medical board determines	126
under section 4785.03 of the Revised Code that an applicant	127
meets the requirements for a license to practice as a surgical	128
assistant, the secretary board shall issue the license to the	129
applicant. The license shall be valid for a two-year period	130
unless revoked or suspended, shall expire on the date that is	131

two years after the date of issuance, and may be renewed for 132 additional two-vear periods in accordance with rules adopted 133 under section 4785.08 of the Revised Code. 134 (B) Each applicant seeking to renew a license issued under 135 this section shall complete continuing education in accordance 136 with rules adopted under section 4785.08 of the Revised Code. 137 (C) In the event a license issued under this section is 138 not renewed and is therefore expired or inactive, the board 139 shall reinstate or restore the license if the individual seeking 140 reinstatement or restoration satisfies the conditions specified 141 in rules adopted under section 4785.08 of the Revised Code. 142 Sec. 4785.05. An individual who holds a current, valid 143 license to practice as a surgical assistant may assist a 144 physician in the performance of surgical procedures by engaging 145 in one or more of the following activities: 146 (A) Providing exposure; 147 (B) Maintaining hemostasis; 148 149 (C) Performing one or more of the following tasks: 150 (1) Making incisions; (2) Closing or suturing surgical sites; 151 (3) Manipulating or removing tissue; 152 (4) Implanting surgical devices or drains; 153 (5) Suctioning surgical sites; 154 155 (6) Placing catheters; (7) Clamping or cauterizing vessels or tissues; 156 (8) Applying dressings to surgical sites; 157

(9) Any other tasks as directed by the physician.	158
Sec. 4785.06. (A) Subject to division (B) of this section,	159
an individual may practice as a surgical assistant without	160
holding a current, valid license issued under section 4785.04 of	161
the Revised Code if all of the following apply:	162
(1) The hospital or ambulatory surgical facility at which	163
the individual practices or intends to practice has submitted to	164
the state medical board, on behalf of its current and	165
prospective employees, an application for a waiver from the	166
requirement that surgical assistants be licensed by the board	167
under this chapter.	168
(2) As part of the application, the hospital or facility	169
submits evidence that it is located in an area of the state that	170
experiences special health problems and physician practice	171
patterns that limit access to surgical care.	172
(3) After receiving and reviewing the application, the	173
board grants to the hospital's or facility's employees a waiver	174
from the licensure requirements of this chapter.	175
(B) An individual may practice as a surgical assistant	176
without holding a current, valid license issued under section	177
4785.04 of the Revised Code if the individual practices only at	178
a hospital or ambulatory surgical facility that has been granted	179
a waiver under this section. When practicing as a surgical	180
assistant, the individual is subject to sections 4785.05 and	181
4785.07 of the Revised Code.	182
Sec. 4785.07. The state medical board shall limit, revoke,	183
or suspend an individual's license to practice as a surgical	184
assistant, refuse to issue a license to an applicant, refuse to	185
renew a license, refuse to reinstate a license, or reprimand or	186

place on probation the holder of a license for any of the 187 reasons specified in rules adopted under section 4785.08 of the 188 Revised Code. 189 Sec. 4785.08. (A) The state medical board shall adopt 190 rules establishing standards and procedures for the regulation 191 of surgical assistants. The rules shall be adopted in accordance 192 with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code and shall do all of the 193 194 following: 195 (1) Establish application procedures and fees for the licensure of surgical assistants, including procedures and fees 196 for the completion of criminal records checks; 197 (2) Specify the criminal offenses for which an applicant 198 will be disqualified from licensure; 199 (3) Establish license renewal procedures and fees, 200 including procedures for reporting the completion of continuing 201 <u>education;</u> 202 (4) Specify the number of credits, hours, or units of 203 continuing education that must be completed to renew a license; 204 (5) Specify the amount of a civil penalty that may be 205 imposed for violating division (A) of section 4785.02 of the 206 207 Revised Code; (6) Specify the reasons for which the board may refuse to 208 issue or renew, suspend, or revoke a license or otherwise impose 209 discipline on a license holder; 210 (7) Establish procedures for waiver applications submitted 211 pursuant to section 4785.06 of the Revised Code; 212 (8) Specify conditions to be satisfied before the board 213 reinstates or restores an expired or inactive license; 214

(9) Establish procedures for reporting to the board	215
license holder misconduct;	216
(10) Establish procedures by which the board conducts	217
disciplinary investigations.	218
(B) In addition to the rules described in division (A) of	219
this section, the board may adopt any other rules it considers	220
necessary to implement and administer this chapter.	221
Section 2. That existing sections 4731.07 and 4731.071 of	222
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	223
