BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

As a part of 1028 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1029 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1030 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1031 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1032
