To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.516 of the Revised Code to create the	2
"University of Alabama" license plate.	3

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.516 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495,	10

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	34
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	35
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	36
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	37
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	38
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	39
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	40
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	41

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 42 other abortion-related activities. 43

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar44receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the45organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall46deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that47organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend48the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same49

manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 50 other money in that fund. 51 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 52 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 53 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 54 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 55 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 57 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 58 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 59 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 60 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 61 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 62 directly to their clients. 63 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64 65

receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar69receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the70Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the71contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social72support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 75 St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 76 its research and other programs. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 79 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 80 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 82 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 83 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 84 contributions for its research and other programs. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 87 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 88 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 89 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 92 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 93 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 94 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 96 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 97 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 98 contributions into its general account to be used for 99 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 100 America foundation. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar102receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the1034-H youth development program of the Ohio state university104extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay105the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.106

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 107

pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio108cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for109scholarships and other educational activities.110

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 111 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 112 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 113 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 114 that organization. 115

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar116receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to117Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for118scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or119events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.120

The registrar shall pay the contributions received121pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the122organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that123organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in124need.125

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar126receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a127kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the128Ohio chapters of a kid again.129

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 130 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 131 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 132 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 133 section. A university or college that receives contributions 134 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 135 scholarship fund. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 138 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 139 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 140 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 141 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 142 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 143 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 144 funds as provided in this section. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to the university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio cyclists of all ages.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 161 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 162 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 163 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 164 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 165 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 166

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar167receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the168fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for169the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the170lighthouses of fairport harbor.171

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar172receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the173Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the174contributions only to promote and support the football team of175Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 178 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 180 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 181 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 182 sponsors within this state. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 185 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 186 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 187 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 188 activities. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 191 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 192 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 193 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 194 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 197 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 198 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 199 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 200 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 201 202 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 203 the improvement of patient outcomes. 204

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 205 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 206 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 207 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 208 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 209 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 210 personnel, veterans, and their families. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 213 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 214 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 215 families. 216

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 217 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 218 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 219 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 220 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 221 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 222 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 223 destination. 224

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to

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the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code226to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use227the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and228programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.229

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 230 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 231 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 232 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 233 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 234 235 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 236 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 237 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 238 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 239 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 244 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 245 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 246 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 247 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 248 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 249 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 250 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 251 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 252 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 253 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 2.54 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 255

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under this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar262receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the263western reserve historical society, which shall use the264contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.265

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar266receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the267Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple268negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the269contributions for charitable and educational purposes.270

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 271 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 272 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 273 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 274 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 275 the person who paid the contribution resides. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 278 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 279 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 280 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 281 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 282 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 283 284 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and

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managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 285
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 286
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 287
such payments are to be made. 288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar302receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the303Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the304contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 306 receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 307 girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 308 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar310receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the311Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those312contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational313

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local beekeeping programs. 315 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 317 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 318 contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 319 legends to inspire future leaders. 320 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 321 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 322 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 323 the contributions for educational purposes. 324 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 325 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 326 Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 327 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 328 The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 329 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 330 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 331 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 332 333 professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate 334 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 335 of the county of residence of an applicant. 336 The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 337

contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 338 the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 339 that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 340 participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 341 (G) of that section. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 344 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 345 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 346 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 347 Ohio and for educational programs. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 350 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 351 supporting cancer research. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar359receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the360Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council361shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner362throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 365 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 366 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 367 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 368 scouts. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar370receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the371

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Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council372shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner373throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 375 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 376 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 377 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar379receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the380Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,381which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.382

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 383 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 384 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 385 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 386 charitable purposes. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 389 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 390 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 391 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 394 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 395 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 396 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 397 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 398 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 400

pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio401concerns of police survivors, which shall use those402contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate403to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed404in the line of duty.405

The registrar shall pay the contributions received406pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater407Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those408contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in409the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.410

The registrar shall pay the contributions received411pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio412association of chiefs of police.413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar419receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the420fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall421use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.422

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar423receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the424organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL425association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under426Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association427shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in428administering a program to secure the proper representation in429

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the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent430children, and for the training and supervision of persons431participating in that program.432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar433receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the434Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the435contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar437receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the438Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,439which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and440advocacy purposes throughout the state.441

442 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 443 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 444 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 445 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 446 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 447 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 448 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 449 lives to the fullest. 450

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar451receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to452Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the453contributions into its general account to be used for purposes454of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar456receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the457Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to458

commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 459 Cleveland, Ohio. 460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 461 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 462 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 463 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 464 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 465 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 466 resides. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar468receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the469Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the470contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting471law enforcement education and assistance.472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar473receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the474Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the475moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section4764503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written477agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar479receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the480rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,481Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and482used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the483rotary foundation.484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar485receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the486Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the487

contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained488under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.489

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar490receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to491buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the492contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.493

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar494receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the495municipal corporation of Twinsburg.496

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 497 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 498 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 499 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 500 connection. 501

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1044receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to1045John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school1046shall not use the contributions it receives for any political1047purpose.1048

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1049 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1050 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1051 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1052 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1053 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1054 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1055 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1056

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1057receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1058Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1059corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1060contributions for any political purpose.1061

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1062receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1063Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1064Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1065any political purpose.1066

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1067receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1068Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1069high school shall not use the contributions for any political1070purpose.1071

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1072receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1073friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1074to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1075emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1076

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1077 receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1078 Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1079 activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1080 city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1081

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1082 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1083 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1084 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1085 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1086 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1087 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1088 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1089
