Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced in division (B) of this section.

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 36 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 37 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 38 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 39 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 40 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 41 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 42 other money in that fund. 43

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The registrar shall pay the contributions received44pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism45society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs46and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar70receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to71special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions72

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar127receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the128university or college whose name or marking or design appears on129collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that130

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section. A university or college that receives contributions 131 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 132 scholarship fund. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 135 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 136 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 144 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 145 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 146 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 147 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 148 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 149 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 1.50 funds as provided in this section. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 153 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 154 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 155 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 156 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 157 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 158 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 159 funds as provided in this section. 160

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 162 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 163 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 164 cyclists of all ages. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 167 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 168 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 169 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 170 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 171 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar173receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the174fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for175the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the176lighthouses of fairport harbor.177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar178receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the179Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the180contributions only to promote and support the football team of181Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 184 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 186 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 187 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 188 sponsors within this state. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 191 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 192 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 193 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 194 activities. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 197 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 198 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 199 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 200 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 201

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 202 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 203 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 204 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 205 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 206 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 207 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 208 209 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and the improvement of patient outcomes. 210

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 211 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 212 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 213 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 214 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 215 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 216 personnel, veterans, and their families. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar218receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the219

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disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 220 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 221 families. 222

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 223 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 224 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 225 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 226 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 227 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 228 229 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 230 destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 236 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 237 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 238 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 239 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 240 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 241 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 242 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 243 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 244 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 245 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar247receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the248rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.249

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 250 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 251 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 252 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 253 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 2.54 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 255 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 256 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 257 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 258 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 259 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 260 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 261 under this section. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar268receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the269western reserve historical society, which shall use the270contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar272receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the273Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple274negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the275contributions for charitable and educational purposes.276

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar277receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the278central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities,279

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which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the280Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory281the person who paid the contribution resides.282

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 283 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 284 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 285 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 286 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 287 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 288 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 289 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 290 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 291 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 292 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 293 such payments are to be made. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 300 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 301 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 302 nature preserve. 303

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 304 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 305 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 306 the money in support of the park. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 309 Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 310 contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar312receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the313girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the314contributions to support the activities of the organization.315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 317 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 318 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 319 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 320 local beekeeping programs. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar322receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the323national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the324contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace325legends to inspire future leaders.326

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar327receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to328keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the329contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities330to take greater responsibility for improving the local331environment through litter prevention, beautification, community332greening, waste reduction, and recycling.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 335 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 336 the contributions for educational purposes. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar338receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the339Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the340contributions to support the activities of the organization.341

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 342 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 343 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 344 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 345 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 346 347 commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 348 of the county of residence of an applicant. 349

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each350contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of351the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates352that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is353participating in the license plate program pursuant to division354(G) of that section.355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 357 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 358 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 359 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 360 Ohio and for educational programs. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar362receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to363pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of364supporting cancer research.365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 483 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 484 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 485 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 486 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 487 resides. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar489receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the490Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the491contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting492law enforcement education and assistance.493
