## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) As used in this section:				
(1) "Employer" means the state or any agency or	4			
instrumentality of the state, and any municipal corporation,				
county, township, school district, or other political				
subdivision or any agency or instrumentality thereof.				
(2) "First responder" means all of the following:	8			
(a) A regular police officer employed by a municipal	9			
corporation or township;				
(b) A regular firefighter employed by a municipal	11			
corporation, township, or joint fire district;				
(c) A qualified employee in the uniform division of the	13			
State Highway Patrol;	14			
(d) A county deputy sheriff;	15			

(e) An investigator, as defined in section 109.541 of the 16 Revised Code, of the bureau of criminal identification and 17 investigation who is commissioned by the superintendent of the 18 bureau as a special agent for the purpose of assisting law 19 enforcement officers or providing emergency assistance to peace 20 officers pursuant to authority granted under that section; 21 (f) A jail officer as described in section 341.05 of the 22 Revised Code; 23 (g) A volunteer firefighter as defined in section 146.01 24 of the Revised Code; 25 (h) An individual employed by an employer in a position 26 that requires a certificate issued under section 4765.30 of the 27 Revised Code to practice as a first responder, emergency medical 28 technician-basic, emergency medical technician-intermediate, or 29 emergency medical technician paramedic, whether paid or 30 volunteer. 31 (3) "State agency" has the same meaning as in section 1.60 32 of the Revised Code. 33

(B) The One-Time Bonus Awards to Pandemic First Responders Program is created to provide one-time bonus awards to eligible first responders. A first responder is eligible to receive a one-time bonus award under this section if, with respect to the period beginning March 1, 2020, and ending on the date on which the first responder's employer submits a certification under division (D) of this section, the first responder meets both of following requirements:

(1) The first responder has continuously been employed as42a first responder by any employer;43

(2) The first responder was not subject to any form of

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disciplinary action, including a written reprimand, suspension, 45 dismissal, or voluntary or involuntary demotion associated with 46 a disciplinary action. 47

(C) (1) An eligible first responder shall receive a one-48time bonus award in the following amounts:49

(a) For a full-time first responder, one thousand dollars;

(b) For a part-time first responder, volunteer firefighter, or first responder described in division (A)(2)(h) who performs services for the employer on a volunteer basis, five hundred dollars.

(2) An eligible first responder employed on a full-timebasis at any time during the time period described in division(B) of this section shall receive the one-time bonus award ofone thousand dollars under this section, regardless of whetherthe first responder serves in a full-time position at the timethe employer issues the award.

(D) Not later than thirty days after the effective date of
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this section, each employer that employs an eligible first
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responder shall certify both of the following to the Attorney
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General in accordance with any guidelines the Attorney General
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establishes under division (F) of this section:

(1) The number of first responders employed by the
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employer who meet the eligibility requirements under division
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(B) of this section to receive a one-time bonus award;
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(2) The award amount for which each eligible first69responder qualifies under division (C) of this section.70

(E) (1) Not later than ninety days after the effective dateof this section, the Attorney General shall distribute the72

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73 appropriate funds to each employer that submitted a certification under division (D) of this section in accordance 74 with any guidelines the Attorney General establishes under 75 division (F) of this section. 76 77 (2) On the Attorney General distributing the funds, each employer that receives funds shall, as soon as administratively 78 practicable, issue the one-time bonus award to each eligible 79 first responder. 80 (F)(1) The Attorney General may do either of the 81 82 following: (a) Require any employer to provide the Attorney General 83 with any information necessary to carry out the Attorney 84 General's duties under this section, including payroll and 85 employment records; 86 (b) Establish guidelines regarding either of the 87 following: 88 (i) The certification requirement described in division 89 (D) of this section, including the manner by which each employer 90 shall submit a certification under that division; 91

(ii) The manner by which the Attorney General shall92distribute funds under division (E)(1) of this section.93

(2) The Attorney General shall not establish eligibility
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requirements that are in addition to the requirements described
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in division (B) of this section for a first responder to receive
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a one-time bonus award.

(G) No award issued under this section shall be considered
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earnable salary for purposes of Chapter 145. of the Revised
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Code, salary for purposes of Chapter 742. of the Revised Code,
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or salary for purposes of Chapter 5505. of the Revised Code.	101			
(H) Eligibility for, the amount of, and payment of a one-	102			
time bonus award under this section are not appropriate subjects				
of bargaining under Chapter 4117. of the Revised Code.				
(I) The Auditor of State may audit the program created	105			
under this section, including any spending by an employer under				
it against an employer's payroll and employment records, with				
respect to either of the following:	108			
(1) The certification an employer submits to the Attorney	109

Section 2. All items in this section are hereby	113			
appropriated as designated out of any moneys in the state	114			
treasury to the credit of the designated fund. For all				
appropriations made in this act, those in the first column are				
for fiscal year 2022 and those in the second column are for	117			
fiscal year 2023. The appropriations made in this act are in	118			
addition to any other appropriations made for the FY 2022-FY	119

The foregoing appropriation item 055665, First Responder124Awards - ARPA, shall be used by the Attorney General, in125accordance with Section 9901 of the "American Rescue Plan Act of1262021," Pub. L. No. 117-2, to provide a one-time bonus award to127eligible first responders, as described in Section 1 of this128act. Of the foregoing appropriation item, the Attorney General129may use \$125,000 to pay for related administrative expenses.130

Section 4. Within the limits set forth in this act, the 131 Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 132 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 133 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 134 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 135 from appropriations contained in this act shall be accounted for 136 as though made in the main operating appropriations act of the 137 134th General Assembly. The appropriations made in this act are 138 subject to all provisions of the main operating appropriations 139 act of the 134th General Assembly that are generally applicable 140 to such appropriations. 141

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
