# A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.885 of the Revised Code to create the	2
"Stephen T. Badin High School" license plate.	3

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.885 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28 other money in that fund. 29 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34

receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40 directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with45pancreatic cancer and their families.46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar56receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to57special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions58for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78 America foundation. 79 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84 85 The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 97 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the100organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that101organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in102need.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar104receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a105kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the106

Ohio chapters of a kid again.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111 section. A university or college that receives contributions 112 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113 scholarship fund. 114

115 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 116 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 117 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 118 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 119 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 120 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 121 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 122 funds as provided in this section. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 125 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 126 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 127 cyclists of all ages.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 130 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 131 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 132 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 133 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 134 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 135

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 136 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 137 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 138 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 139 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar141receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the142Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the143contributions only to promote and support the football team of144Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 146 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 147 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 149 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 150 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 151 sponsors within this state. 152

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 153 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 154 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 155 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 156 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 157 activities. 158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 159 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 160 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 161 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 162 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 163 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 165 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 166 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 167 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 168 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 169 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 170 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 171 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 172 the improvement of patient outcomes. 173

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 194

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 199 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 200 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 201 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 202 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 203 204 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 205 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 206 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 207 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 208 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 209

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar454receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the455Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the456

contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained457under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar459receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to460buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the461contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.462

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar463receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the464municipal corporation of Twinsburg.465

armed forces who died during their service.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area research projects.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 491 receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 492 Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 493 contributions solely to promote and support the historical 494 preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 495 state. 496

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar497receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the498Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those499contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth500baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.501

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 502 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 503 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 504 505 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school district's students that assist 506 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 507 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 508 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 509 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 510 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 511 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 512 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 513 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 514 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 515
