amended and section 4758.201 of the Revised Code be enacted to	16

Sec. 3923.29. (A)(1) Every policy of group sickness and	18
accident insurance providing hospital, surgical, or medical	19

expense coverage for other than specific diseases or accidents	20
only, and delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed in this	21
state on or after January 1, 1979, shall provide for each	22
eligible person under the policy who resides in this state,	23
outpatient, inpatient, and intermediate primary care benefits	24
for alcoholism that are at least equal to five hundred fifty	25
dollars in any calendar year or twelve-month period.	26
(2) The services shall be legally performed by or under	27
the clinical supervision of any of the following:	28
(a) A physician authorized under Chapter 4731. of the	29
Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic	30
medicine and surgery;	31
(b) A psychologist licensed under Chapter 4732. of the	32
Revised Code;	33
(c) A licensed professional clinical counselor, licensed	34
professional counselor, independent social worker, or	35
independent marriage and family therapist licensed under Chapter	36
4757. of the Revised Code whose practice includes <del>chemical</del>	37
<pre>dependency substance use disorder counseling;</pre>	38
(d) An independent chemical dependency counselor licensed	39
under Chapter 4758. of the Revised Code;	40
(e) A clinical nurse specialist or certified nurse	41
practitioner licensed under Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code	42
whose nursing specialty is mental health.	43
(3) The services may be performed in an office, in a	44
hospital, in a community mental health facility, or in an	45
alcoholism treatment facility so long as the hospital, community	46
mental health facility, or alcoholism treatment facility is	47
approved by the joint commission, the council on accreditation,	48

or the commission on accreditation of rehabilitation facilities	49
or certified by the department of mental health and addiction	50
services.	51
(B) The benefits mandated by division (A) of this section	52
shall be subject to reasonable contract limitations and may be	53
subject to reasonable deductibles and co-insurance costs.	54
Persons entitled to such benefit under more than one service or	55
insurance contract may be limited to a single five hundred fifty	56
dollar benefit for services under all contracts.	57
(C) For an eligible person, who receives treatment for	58
alcoholism from an approved or certified alcoholism treatment	59
facility, to remain entitled to the benefits mandated by	60
division (A) of this section, a health care professional	61
identified in division (A)(2) of this section shall every three	62
months certify that such person needs to continue utilizing such	63
treatment.	64
(D) In order to qualify for participation under division	65
(A) of this section, every facility specified in such division	66
shall have in effect a plan for utilization review and a plan	67
for peer review and every person specified in such division	68
shall have in effect a plan for peer review. Such plans shall	69
have the purpose of ensuring high quality patient care and	70
effective and efficient utilization of available health	71
facilities and services. Such person or facility shall also have	72
in effect a program of rehabilitation or a program of	73
rehabilitation and detoxification.	74
(E) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require	75

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an insurer to pay benefits which are greater than usual,

(C) "Chemical dependency conditions Substance use	99
disorders" means those conditions relating to the abuse of or	100
dependency on alcohol or other drugs that are classified in	101
accepted nosologies, including the diagnostic and statistical	102
manual of mental disorders and the international classification	103
of diseases, and in editions of those nosologies published after	104
December 23, 2002.	105

(D) "Chemical dependency Substance use disorder	106
counseling" means rendering or offering to render to	107
individuals, groups, or the public a counseling service	108
involving the application of alcohol and other drug clinical	109
counseling principles, methods, or procedures to assist	110
individuals who are abusing or dependent on alcohol or other	111
drugs.	112
(E) "Gambling disorder" means a persistent and recurring	113
maladaptive gambling behavior that is classified in accepted	114
nosologies, including the diagnostic and statistical manual of	115
mental disorders and the international classification of	116
diseases, and in editions of those nosologies published after	117
September 15, 2014.	118
(F) "Prevention services" means a comprehensive, multi-	119
system set of individual and environmental approaches that	120
maximizes physical health, promotes safety, and precludes the	121
onset of behavioral health disorders.	122
(G) Unless the context provides otherwise, "scope of	123
practice" means the services, methods, and techniques in which	124
and the areas for which a person who holds a license,	125
certificate, or endorsement under this chapter is trained and	126
qualified.	127
(H) "Substance abuse professional" has the same meaning as	128
in 49 C.F.R. 40.3.	129
(I) "U.S. department of transportation drug and alcohol	130
testing program" means a transportation workplace drug and	131
alcohol testing program governed by 49 C.F.R. part 40.	132

(B) The governor shall appoint all of the following voting	197
members of the board with the advice and consent of the senate:	198

chemical dependency counselor license issued under this chapter,	201
including at least two of whom have received at least a master's	202
degree in a field related to chemical dependency substance use	203

shall meet to discuss matters relating to the administration and	241
operation of the board and the regulation of the practices of	242

prevention services. The board shall hold at least one regular	244
meeting every three months. Additional meetings may be held at	245
such times as the board determines, on the call of the	246
chairperson, or on the written request to the executive director	247
of three or more voting board members. If three or more voting	248
members request a meeting, the executive director shall call a	249

meeting, which shall be held not later than seven days after the

request is received.

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Seven Six voting members of the board constitute a quorum	252
to conduct business. Except as provided in section 4758.32 of	253
the Revised Code, no action shall be taken without the	254
concurrence of at least a quorum.	255
At its first meeting each year, the board shall elect a	256
chairperson from among its voting members. No member shall serve	257
more than two consecutive terms as chairperson.	258
The board shall keep any records and minutes necessary to	259
