| agency each health care professional that the agency provides to | 159 |

| (J) Carry professional malpractice and general liability | 179 |

| services by the health care staffing agency and the provision of | 181 |

| (K) Secure and maintain workers' compensation coverage in | 184 |

| Sec. 3724.08. A health care staffing agency shall not do_ | 189 |

| (A) Restrict the employment opportunities of its | 191 |
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| employees, including by requiring any of the following: | 192 |
| (1) That an employee pay money to terminate employment or | 193 |
| otherwise cease to provide services; | 194 |
| (2) That an employee enter into a post-termination of | 195 |
| services noncompete agreement; | 196 |
| (3) That an employee accept an employment buyout. | 197 |
| (B) Require in any contract with an employee or health | 198 |
| care facility the payment of liquidated damages, employment | 199 |
| fees, or other compensation related to an employee being hired | 200 |
| as a permanent employee of the health care facility; | 201 |
| (C) Recruit, solicit, or entice an employee of a health | 202 |
| <pre>care facility to leave the employee's employment;</pre> | 203 |
| (D) Pay or make a gift to any staff of a health care | 204 |

| Sec. 3724.09. (A) The total amount a health care staffing | 208 |
| agency charges a health care facility for any employee, | 209 |
| including for all wages and any other fees or charges associated | 210 |
| with that employee, when converted to an hourly rate for the | 211 |
| employee based on the total hours worked for a given period, | 212 |
| shall not be more than fifteen per cent above the hourly rate | 213 |
| the agency pays to a health care professional for that same | 214 |
| period. The hourly rate paid by a health care staffing agency to | 215 |
| a health care professional shall be calculated based on the | 216 |
| gross amount paid to a health care professional by the health | 217 |

| issue a registration, refuse to renew or reinstate a | 234 |

| 3701.83 of the Revised Code. The amounts shall be used solely | 284 |
| for purposes of administering and enforcing this chapter and the | 285 |
| rules adopted under it. | 286 |
| Sec. 3724.14. An employee of a health care staffing agency | 287 |
| or any health care facility may assert a cause of action against | 288 |
| a health care staffing agency for a violation of this chapter in | 289 |
| a court of common pleas in the county where the violation has | 290 |
| occurred. If the court finds a violation, it shall award the | 291 |
| plaintiff actual damages, costs, and reasonable attorney's fees. | 292 |
| If the plaintiff cannot prove actual damages, the court shall | 293 |
| award punitive damages, in an amount not less than ten thousand | 294 |
| dollars, plus costs and reasonable attorney's fees. | 295 |
| Sec. 3724.99. Whoever violates section 3724.06 of the | 296 |
| Revised Code is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree on | 297 |
| a first offense; for each subsequent offense, the person is | 298 |
| guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree. | 299 |
| Section 2. That existing section 3701.83 of the Revised | 300 |
| Code is hereby repealed | 301 |
