BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	5
4503.964 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	7
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	8
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	9
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	10
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	11
in division (B) of this section.	12
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	13
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	14
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	15
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	16
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	17
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	18
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	19

quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 49 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 50 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 51 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 52

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar57receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to58special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions59for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.60

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar61receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the62children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the63contributions for its research and other programs.64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar65receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to66the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to67raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic68pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 70 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 71 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 72 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 73 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 74

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar75receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the76future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the77

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contributions into its general account to be used for78educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of79America foundation.80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 82 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 83 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 84 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 86 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 87 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 88 scholarships and other educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 91 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 92 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 93 that organization. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar95receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to96Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for97scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or98events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received100pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the101organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that102organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in103need.104

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar105receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a106

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kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 107 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 108 The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 110 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 111 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 112 section. A university or college that receives contributions 113 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 114 scholarship fund. 115 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 116 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 117 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 118 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 119 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 120 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 121 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 122 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 123 funds as provided in this section. 124 125

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 126 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 127 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 128 cyclists of all ages. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 131 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 132 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 133 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 134 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 135 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar137receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the138fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for139the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the140lighthouses of fairport harbor.141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 147 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 148 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 149 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 150 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 151district shall use the money it receives under this section to 152 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 153 sponsors within this state. 1.54

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 162 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 163 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 164 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 165 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 166

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 167 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 168 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 169 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 170 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 171 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 172 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 173 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 174 the improvement of patient outcomes. 175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 176 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 177 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 178 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 179 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 180 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 181 personnel, veterans, and their families. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 184 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 185 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 186 families. 187

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 188 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 189 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 190 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 191 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 192 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 193 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 194 destination. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 196

the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code197to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use198the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and199programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.200

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 201 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 202 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 203 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 204 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 205 206 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 207 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 208 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 209 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 210 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 216 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 217 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 218 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 219 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 220 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 221 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 222 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 223 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 224 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 225 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 226

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under this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar233receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the234western reserve historical society, which shall use the235contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.236

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar237receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the238Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple239negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the240contributions for charitable and educational purposes.241

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 242 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 243 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 244 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 245 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 246 the person who paid the contribution resides. 247

248 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 249 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 250 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 251 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 252 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 253 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 254 255 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and

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managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 256
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 257
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 258
such payments are to be made. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar273receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the274Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the275contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar281receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the282Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those283contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational284

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local beekeeping programs. 286 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 287 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 288 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 289 contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 290 legends to inspire future leaders. 291 292 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 293 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 294 the contributions for educational purposes. 295 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 297 Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 298 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 299 The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 300 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 301 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 302 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 303 304 professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate 305 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 306 of the county of residence of an applicant. 307 The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 308 contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar320receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to321pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of322supporting cancer research.323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar330receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the331Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council332shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner333throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 336 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 337 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 338 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 339 scouts. 340

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar341receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the342

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Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council343shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner344throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.345

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 365 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 366 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 367 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 368 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 369 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 370

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 371

pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio372concerns of police survivors, which shall use those373contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate374to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed375in the line of duty.376

The registrar shall pay the contributions received377pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater378Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those379contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in380the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.381

The registrar shall pay the contributions received382pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio383association of chiefs of police.384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar390receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the391fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall392use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 395 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 396 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 397 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 398 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 399 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 400

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the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent401children, and for the training and supervision of persons402participating in that program.403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar404receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the405Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the406contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.407

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 408 receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 409 Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 410 which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 411 advocacy purposes throughout the state. 412

413 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 414 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 415 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 416 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 417 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 418 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 419 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 420 lives to the fullest. 421

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar422receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to423Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the424contributions into its general account to be used for purposes425of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.426

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar427receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the428Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to429

commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 430 Cleveland, Ohio. 431 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 433 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 434 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 435 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 436 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 437 resides. 438

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar439receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the440Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the441contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting442law enforcement education and assistance.443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 445 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 446 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 447 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 448 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar450receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the451rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,452Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and453used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the454rotary foundation.455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar456receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the457Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the458

contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained459under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.460

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar461receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to462buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the463contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.464

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar465receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the466municipal corporation of Twinsburg.467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 469 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 470 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 471 connection. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar473receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the474Medina county historical society, which shall use those475contributions to distribute between the various historical476societies and museums in Medina county.477

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar478receives pursuant to section 4503.765 of the Revised Code to the479Amaranth grand chapter foundation, which shall use the480contributions for communal outreach, charitable service, and481scholarship purposes.482

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar483receives pursuant to section 4503.767 of the Revised Code to484folds of honor of central Ohio, which shall use the485contributions to provide scholarships to spouses and children486either of disabled veterans or of members of any branch of the487

armed forces who died during their service.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area research projects.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 493 receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the 494 Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those 495 contributions solely to promote and support the historical 496 preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this 497 state. 498

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar499receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the500Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those501contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth502baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.503

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 504 receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 505 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 506 507 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school district's students that assist 508 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 509 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 510 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 511 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 512 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 513 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 514 superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 515 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 516 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 517

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that the school district hires to provide those services. The 518 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 519 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 520 training in providing such services to the students of the 521 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 522 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 523 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 524 Internal Revenue Code. The school district shall not use the 525 contributions it receives for any other purpose. 526

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 527 receives pursuant to section 4503.872 of the Revised Code to the 528 Canton city school district. The application may be combined with a request 1071 for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 1072 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed 1073 application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) 1074 and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the 1075 applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of 1076 "Chardon High School State Football Champs" license plates and a 1077 validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1078 by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1079

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1080 inscribed on the license plates, "Chardon High School State 1081 Football Champs" license plates shall display an appropriate 1082 logo and words that are selected by representatives of Chardon 1083 high school and approved by the registrar. "Chardon High School 1084 State Football Champs" license plates shall display county 1085 identification stickers that identify the county of registration 1086 as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1087

(B) "Chardon High School State Football Champs" license1088plates and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone,1089shall be issued upon receipt of an application for registration1090of a motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular1091

license tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised	1092	
Code, any applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under		
Chapter 4504. of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee		
prescribed by section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an		
additional administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution

(C)(1) For each application for registration and	1100	
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this	1101	
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty	1102	
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the	1103	
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution		
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code.		
(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of	1106
