## A BILL

To amend section 3319.226 and to enact section	1
3319.362 of the Revised Code regarding educator	2
licenses for substitute teachers and to declare	3
an emergency.	4

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3319.226 be amended and section	5
3319.362 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3319.226. (A) Beginning July 1, 2019, the state board	7
of education shall issue educator licenses for substitute	8
teaching only under this section.	9
(B) The state board shall adopt rules establishing	10
standards and requirements for obtaining a license under this	11
section and for renewal of the license. Except as provided in	12
division (D) or (E) of this section or in division (F) of	13
section 3319.229 of the Revised Code, the rules shall require an	14
applicant to hold <u>at least</u> a <del>post-secondary <u>b</u>achelor's degree</del> ,	15
but not in any specified subject area. <del>The <u>Except</u> as provided in</del>	16
division (E) of this section, the rules also shall allow the	17

holder of a license issued under this section to work: 18

(1) For an unlimited number of school days if the license holder has at least a post-secondary bachelor's degree in either education or a subject area directly related to the subject of the class the license holder will teach;

(2) For one full semester, subject to the approval of the 23 employing school district board of education, if the license 24 holder has <u>at least</u> a post-secondary <u>bachelor's</u> degree in a 25 subject area that is not directly related to the subject of the 26 class that the license holder will teach.

The district superintendent may request that the board approve one or more additional subsequent semester-long periods of teaching for the license holder of a license issued under division (B)(1) of this section.

(C) The rules adopted under division (B) of this section shall permit a substitute career-technical teaching license holder to teach outside the license holder's certified career field for up to one semester, subject to approval of the employing school district superintendent.

(D) Division (D) of this section does not apply on or 37 after June 30, 2025. 38 39 The state board shall adopt rules for the issuance of an educator license for substitute teaching for six or more 40 consecutive days in the same classroom to an applicant who 41 fulfills one or more of the following qualifications: 42 (1) Holds an associate degree and is at least twenty-one 43 years of age; 44

(2) Received an honorable discharge from the armed forces

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of the United States, as defined in section 3307.75 of the	46
Revised Code, and is at least twenty-one years of age;	47
(3) Earned at least sixty credit hours of coursework	48
toward a bachelor's degree and is at least twenty-one years of	49
<u>age;</u>	50
(4) Has at least five years of experience as an	51
educational assistant as defined in section 3319.088 of the	52
Revised Code.	53
(E) Division (E) of this section does not apply on or	54
<u>after June 30, 2025.</u>	55
The state board shall adopt rules for the issuance of an	56
educator license for substitute teaching for five or fewer	57
consecutive days in the same classroom to an applicant who does	58
not hold at least a bachelor's degree, as long the governing	59
body of the employing school district or school certifies to the	60
state board that the applicant meets the governing body's	61
educational requirements. The state board shall issue the	62
license within ten business days after the employing school	63
governing body certifies that fact to the state board. A	64
district or school governing body may employ the holder of an	65
educator license for substitute teaching issued under division	66
(E) of this section for one full school year.	67
A school governing body may conditionally employ an	68
individual for ten business days prior to the individual's	69
receipt of a license under division (E) of this section, if it	70
has certified to the state board that the applicant meets the	71
governing body's educational requirements and has submitted to	72
the governing body the results of a successful criminal records	73
check under section 3319.291 or 3319.39 of the Revised Code.	74

The state board shall not establish qualifications or	75
certification requirements for the issuance of a license issued	76
under division (E) of this section in addition to those	77
prescribed in that division.	78
(F) Any license issued or renewed under former section	79
3319.226 of the Revised Code that was still in force on November	80
2, 2018, shall remain in force for the remainder of the term for	81
which it was issued or renewed. Upon the expiration of that	82
term, the holder of that license shall be subject to licensure	83
under the rules adopted under this section.	84
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Sec. 3319.362. This section does not apply on or after	85
<u>June 30, 2025.</u>	86
Notwithstanding anything in this chapter to the contrary,	87
an individual who is enrolled in a teacher preparation program,	88
approved under section 3333.048 of the Revised Code, and is	89
assigned to a school as a student teacher or intern may work as	90
a substitute teacher in that school for up to five days. The	91
teacher preparation program in which the individual is enrolled	92
shall credit the hours spent substitute teaching under this	93
section toward the number of student teaching or internship	94
hours required under the program.	95
Section 2. That existing section 3319.226 of the Revised	96
Code is hereby repealed.	97
Section 3. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency	98
measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public	99
peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is to	100
ensure that schools have access to qualified substitute teachers	101
in the event of a teacher shortage and that the act's provisions	102

regarding educator licenses for substitute teachers take effect

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
