То	amend section 3319.226 of the Revised Code	1
	regarding educator licenses for substitute	2
	teachers, to establish a study committee on the	3
	substitute teacher shortage, and to make an	4
	appropriation.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3319.226 of the Revised Code be	6
amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3319.226. (A) Beginning July 1, 2019, the state board	8
of education shall issue educator licenses for substitute	9
teaching only under this section.	10
(B) The state board shall adopt rules establishing	11
standards and requirements for obtaining a license under this	12
section and for renewal of the license. Except as provided in	13
division (D) of this section or in division (F) of section	14
3319.229 of the Revised Code, the rules shall require an	15
applicant to hold at least a post-secondary bachelor's degree,	16

but not in any specified subject area. The rules also shall	17
allow the holder of a license issued under this section to work:	18
(1) For an unlimited number of school days if the license	19
holder has <u>at least</u> a post-secondary <u>bachelor's</u> degree in either	20
education or a subject area directly related to the subject of	21
the class the license holder will teach;	22
(2) For one full semester, subject to the approval of the	23
employing school district board of education, if the license	24
holder has <u>at least</u> a post secondary bachelor's degree in a	25
subject area that is not directly related to the subject of the	26
class that the license holder will teach.	27
The district superintendent may request that the board	28
approve one or more additional subsequent semester-long periods	29
of teaching for the <pre>license</pre> holder of a license issued under	30
division (B)(1) of this section.	31
(C) The rules adopted under division (B) of this section	32
shall permit a substitute career-technical teaching license	33
holder to teach outside the license holder's certified career	34
field for up to one semester, subject to approval of the	35
employing school district superintendent.	36
(D) Division (D) of this section does not apply on or	37
after June 30, 2024.	38
A school governing body may employ an individual who does	39
not hold at least a bachelor's degree as a substitute teacher,	40
provided that the individual meets the following requirements:	41
(1) The individual meets the district's or school's own	42
set of educational requirements.	43
(2) The individual is deemed to be of good moral	44

character.	
(3) The individual successfully completes a criminal	46
records check as prescribed in section 3319.39 of the Revised	47
Code.	48
The state board shall issue a nonrenewable one-year	49
temporary substitute teaching license to an individual who does	50
not hold at least a bachelor's degree but meets the requirements	51
prescribed in division (D) of this section.	52
A license issued under division (D) of this section shall	53
permit an individual to be employed as a substitute teacher for	54
not more than one full school year. Such employment for each	5.5
subsequent school year requires the issuance of a new license.	56
(E) Any license issued or renewed under former section	57
3319.226 of the Revised Code that was still in force on November	58
2, 2018, shall remain in force for the remainder of the term for	59
which it was issued or renewed. Upon the expiration of that	60
term, the holder of that license shall be subject to licensure	61
under the rules adopted under this section.	62
Section 2. That existing section 3319.226 of the Revised	63
Code is hereby repealed.	64
Section 3. All items in this act are hereby appropriated	65
as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the	66
credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations	67
made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year	68
2022 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2023.	69
The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to	70
any other operating appropriations made for the FY 2022-FY 2023	71

to the House and Senate committees that primarily deal with	99	
primary and secondary education not later than October 30, 2022.	100
