## A BILL

То	amend section 121.30 and to enact sections	1
	121.34, 121.341, and 121.342 of the Revised Code	2
	to create the Women's Policy and Research	3
	Commission and the Women's Policy and Research	4
	Center, to specify their powers and duties, and	5
	to make an appropriation.	6

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 121.30 be amended and sections	7
121.34, 121.341, and 121.342 of the Revised Code be enacted to	8
read as follows:	9
Sec. 121.30. As used in sections 121.30 to 121.34 121.33	10
of the Revised Code, "Spanish-speaking people" means persons who	11
possess any of the following characteristics:	12
(A) Use Spanish as their primary language;	13
(B) Regard themselves as or are regarded in their	14
community as being of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central	15
American, South American, Spanish, or other Spanish-speaking	16

origin or descent.	
Sec. 121.34. (A) There is the women's policy and research	18
commission to promote the advancement of women and remove	19
barriers to women's equality. The commission shall consist of	20
fifteen members.	21
(B) The governor shall appoint six members to represent	22
the public, not more than three of whom shall be members of the	23
same political party. Members appointed by the governor may	24
include, but are not limited to, persons who are active in and	25
knowledgeable about the following areas: health and human	26
services, education, business and industry, science and	27
technology, arts and culture, the promotion of social justice,	28
law and government, and volunteerism. The president and minority	29
leader of the senate each shall appoint one member of the	30
senate, and one nonlegislator member to represent the public.	31
The speaker and minority leader of the house of representatives	32
each shall appoint one member of the house of representatives,	33
and one nonlegislator member to represent the public. The	34
governor or the governor's designee shall be a member of the	35
<pre>commission.</pre>	36
Each member of the commission shall be an elector of this	37
state. At least two-thirds of the members of the commission	38
shall be women. The membership of the commission shall reflect	39
the diversity of this state's population with respect to age,	40
race, and ethnic background. The governor, the president and	41
minority leader of the senate, and the speaker and minority	42
leader of the house of representatives shall consult with	43
individuals and organizations that promote the advancement of	44
women to seek their recommendations of persons to serve as	45
public members of the commission.	46

Of the governor's initial appointments to the commission,	47
three shall be to terms that end one year after the effective	48
date of this section, two shall be to terms that end two years	49
after that date, and one shall be to a term that ends three	50
years after that date. The initial appointment of the public	51
member by the speaker of the house of representatives shall be	52
to a term that ends two years after the effective date of this	53
section, and the initial appointment of the public member by the	54
minority leader of the house of representatives shall be to a	55
term that ends three years after that date. The initial	56
appointment of the public member by the president of the senate	57
shall be to a term that ends two years after the effective date	58
of this section, and the initial appointment of the public	59
member by the minority leader of the senate shall be to a term	60
that ends three years after that date. Thereafter, the terms of	61
office of all public members shall be for three years, with each	62
term ending on the same day of the same month as did the term it	63
succeeds.	64
The speaker and minority leader of the house of	65
representatives and the president and minority leader of the	66
senate shall appoint the legislator members to the commission	67
within thirty days after the commencement of the first regular	68
session of each general assembly. These members shall serve on	69
the commission until their respective successors are appointed	70
or until they are no longer members of the general assembly. A	71
public member who has served two consecutive three-year terms on	72
the commission is ineligible for reappointment to the commission	73
until three years have passed since the end of the member's	74
second consecutive three-year term. A legislator member who has	75
served three consecutive terms on the commission is ineligible	76
for reappointment to the commission until two years have passed	77

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since the end of the member's third consecutive term. Vacancies	78
shall be filled in the manner provided for original	79
appointments. Any member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring	80
before the expiration date of the term for which a predecessor	81
was appointed shall hold office as a member for the remainder of	82
that term. A public member shall continue in office following	83
the expiration date of the member's term until a successor is	84
appointed or until a period of ninety days has elapsed,	85
whichever occurs first.	86
(C) Members of the commission shall receive no	87
compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses,	88
actually incurred in the conduct of their official business.	89
(D) The governor shall call the first meeting of the	90
commission within forty-five days after all commission members	91
have been appointed. Thereafter, the commission shall prescribe	92
the manner and the times at which commission meetings shall be	93
called, except that the commission shall meet at least four	94
times annually. The commission shall choose annually from among	95
its members a chair to preside over its meetings, a secretary to	96
keep a record of its proceedings, and such other officers as it	97
considers necessary. A majority of the members of the commission	98
constitutes a quorum.	99
Sec. 121.341. (A) The women's policy and research	100
commission shall do all of the following:	101
(1) Establish policies and procedures governing the	102
operation of the women's policy and research center established	103
under section 121.342 of the Revised Code;	104
(2) Employ an executive director for the center to	105
implement the policies and procedures established under division	106

(A) (1) of this section;	107
(3) Furnish a written report of its activities for the	108
preceding calendar year, not later than the first day of	109
February of each year, to the governor, the president of the	110
senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives.	111
(B) The commission may do any of the following:	112
(1) Hold public hearings to assess the problems and needs	113
of women in this state;	114
(2) Create standing or special committees as needed. These	115
standing or special committees shall be chaired by a member of	116
the commission but may include members who are not members of	117
the commission.	118
(3) Sell publications issued by the commission or the	119
<pre>center;</pre>	120
(4) Accept gifts, donations, benefits, and other funds	121
from any public agency or private source to carry out any or all	122
of the commission's or center's powers or duties.	123
(C) All expenses incurred in carrying out this section and	124
sections 121.34 and 121.342 of the Revised Code are payable	125
solely from the funds of the commission.	126
(D) There is in the state treasury the women's policy and	127
research commission fund. All proceeds from the sale of	128
publications under division (B)(3) of this section and all	129
gifts, donations, benefits, and other funds received by the	130
commission under division (B)(4) of this section shall be	131
deposited in the fund.	132
Sec. 121.342. (A) There is the women's policy and research	133
center under the supervision of the women's policy and research	134

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commission. The center shall do all of the following:	135
(1) Identify, through research, data collection, and	136
<pre>public hearings, barriers to women's equality;</pre>	137
(2) Maintain and make available to the appropriate	138
appointing authorities lists of persons qualified for	139
appointment to positions in state government;	140
(3) Educate the public on the status of women and on the	141
<pre>impact of public policy on women;</pre>	142
(4) Issue reports and recommendations to the executive and	143
legislative branches of state government and to the general	144
<pre>public regarding women's policy issues;</pre>	145
(5) Analyze current and proposed public policies to	146
determine their impact on women, and report the analysis to the	147
<pre>appropriate authorities;</pre>	148
(6) Help the public and private sectors develop programs	149
and services for women;	150
(7) Encourage collaboration between the center and other	151
<pre>public agencies and institutions on issues of mutual interest to</pre>	152
them.	153
(B) The executive director of the center shall appoint the	154
center's employees with the approval of the commission.	155
Section 2. That existing section 121.30 of the Revised	156
Code is hereby repealed.	157
Section 3. All items in this act are hereby appropriated	158
as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the	159
credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations	160
made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year	161

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2022 and those in the second column are for fis	cal year 2023.		162
