BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.581 be amended	6
and section 4503.583 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	7
follows:	8
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	9
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	10
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	11
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	12
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	13
in division (B) of this section.	14
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	15
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	16
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	17

pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or
other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The 1043 school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1044 to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1045 use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1046 in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1047 developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1048 the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1049 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1050 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1051 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1052 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1053 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1054 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1055 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1056 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1057 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1058 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1059 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1060 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1061
